JOB DESCRIPTION

JOB TITLE: Squad Team Member, Appin Rainforest Regeneration Project

REPORTING TO: ACDT Board through the Squad Team Leader

OVERALL PURPOSE OF JOB AND MAIN DUTIES

The post of Squad Team Member will form an integral part of the team responsible for delivering the Appin Rainforest Regeneration Project (ARRP). Working with the Project Manager, Squad Team Leader and Volunteer Team Leader the Squad Members will deliver an initial programme of rhododendron and other invasive species eradication over a six-month period (October 2025 – March 2026).

It is envisaged that the role will become embedded for the long term as part of the planned delivery of the Appin Rainforest Regeneration Project and fundraising is in progress to secure this.

Full training will be provided including certificated training in chainsaw use, chipper use, first aid, herbicide management and application, use of brush cutter and hand tools plus wider aspects of rainforest management. Further training opportunities are likely to be identified as the project progresses.
