This programme is to distribute 1033.63 Metric Tons of High Energy Biscuit to 62,553 children of 304 primary schools in Ukhia and Teknaf of Cox's Bazar District, Bangladesh.

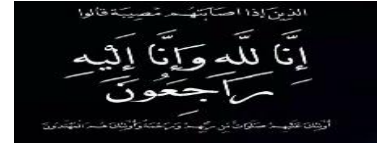

On 3-4 January 2018 the Country Director visited Muslim Aid Institute of Technology (MAIT), Chittagong



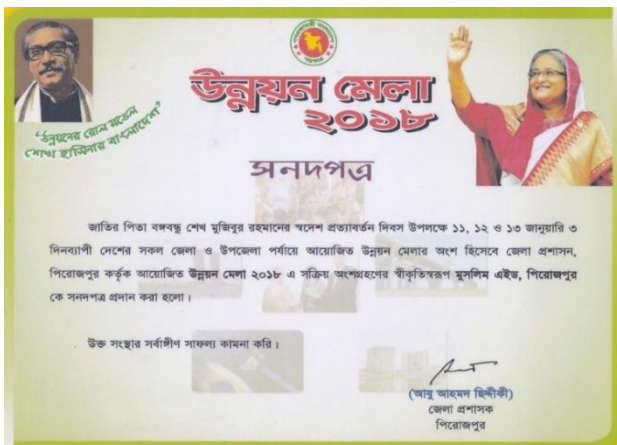

In the first month of the year and the beginning of the new Field Level Agreement (FLA) for 2018 Muslim Aid Bangladesh office distributed packets (75gm each) High Energy Biscuit (HEB) to 62,627 children (Girls: 32,788, Boys: 29,839) of 240 primary schools in Ukhia and Teknaf, Cox's Bazar. Total amount of HEB was 88.350 Metric Tons. **On 29th & 30th January 2018** the Office organized **Expression of Interest (EOI) Meeting** with directly collaboration of Room to Read.

Muslim Aid is now in the form of a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) from Muslim Aid – 295224 to Muslim Aid – 1176462. The CIO will be a separate legal entity with its own charity registration number, but will have the same name. Once established, all assets and

liabilities of the Charity has been transferred to the new CIO through dissolving the Charity in its recent form. The transfer has been completed on 31 January 2018. The new CIO, incorporated by the Charity Commission under the name of Muslim Aid, and governed by its newly broadly-based trustees taken over the running of the charity from the interim manager. There are no legal, economic or social implications of the transfer.
