Programme Update

START Fund Project

Major Interventions:

- ➤ Multipurpose cash Grants: 820HHs @ BDT 4500
- ➤ Hygiene kits: 518 HHs.
- ➤ Health camp with consultation and free medicine: 10 camps for 1000 persons.
- Additional cash grants to 82 HHs @ BDT 1,000





START Fund: Post Distribution Monitoring (PDM)

Muslim Aid distributed cash grants to 820 households with the amount of BDT 4500-5500 with flexibility of its use. In the PDM that was conducted on 10% of its grants recipients it was identified that beneficiaries used the amount for various purposes ranging from food to buying items for self-employment. The breakdown of how the grants were used has been shown below:

Food: 22%; Shelter: 31%; House repair: 6%; Medicines: 13%; Paying debts: 12%; Savings in hand: 5%; Agricultural/livelihood: 5%; Tools & Supplies for self-employment: 1%; Education for children: 2% and Clothing for family members: 3%

Flood Recovery Project in staff recruitment process with UMCOR Funding

United Methodist Committee on Relief A 1-year project, "Flood Recovery and Resilience to Flood Affected Communities in Sirajgonj District Bangladesh" started on 1st May with funds from UMCOR (\$500K). Due to heavy rainfall and flash flood the project has made a delayed start with the plan of its no cost extension at the end. Staff placement and orientation, bank account opening and networking with the local administration and local government bodies were the key activities in the month. Beneficiary selection process has also been started on the ground.

Training on vegetable gardening for the School Kids

Fifty training sessions organized by 12 FMs and facilitated by

SAAO (Sub Assistant Agriculture Officer) were held on Vegetable gardening among the Little Agriculturists (Grade-III, IV & V), concerned school teacher SMC/PTA and Members in Teknaf and Ukhiya Upazilas. Those meetings were held during



the school lunch break and free time of students. Contents of the training

were plant cultivation, good seed, application of fertilizer, nurturing vegetable garden, cooking demonstration on healthy meal, Vitamin in vegetables, role and responsibilities of little agriculturists in vegetable gardening at school premises and homesteads. At first there were formations of 30 little agriculturist groups in Ukhiya upazila and 20 in Teknaf upazila in consultations with the head teachers. Two preparatory meetings were held on Little Agriculturist Training with the Upazila Agriculture Officer and Sub-Assistant Agriculture Officer before organizing the training for the students.
