In October 2018, Muslim Aid participated in various events of national sanitation month and global hand



washing day organized by Pirojpur District Administration. The events, chaired by Abu Ali Md. Sazzad Hossain, Deputy Commissioner (DC) and President District Sanitation Taskforce Committee, Pirojpur saw the participation of all government offices including Department of Public Health Engineering jointly with Muslim Aid, BRAC, World Vision, Asa and many other NGOs working in the district. There were series of discussions, a colorful rally, hand washing

demonstration, and sanitary latrine installations at the low income communities in the area.

Qurbani Review Programme

Muslim Aid organized a review meeting on its Qurbani programme at its Dhaka office in October 2018, where there were participants from implementing offices and key personnel from various parts of the country, responsible for branch/ programme offices.

This year Muslim Aid sacrificed a total of 71 cows with the support of its Headquarters, London across 49 Upazilas of 22 districts in 4 divisions of Bangladesh.

School Feeding and Literacy Programme

Muslim Aid continued to deliver WFP's McGovern Dole International Food for Education and Children Nutrition Programme and School Feeding Programme (SFP) combining literacy component with technical support from Room to Read Bangladesh in Ukhia and Teknaf of Cox's Bazar district.

In October, a total of 32.24 Metric Tons of high energy biscuits were distributed to 57,118 children (girls-27,145, boys-29,973) in 281 schools (GOB and GOB registered MPO school 146, NGO school 122, and Madrasa 13) in Ukhiya and Teknaf upazilas of Cox's Bazar.

Mobile money transfer introduced for Rainbow Family: Child Sponsorship Programme

In the month of October, major progress has been accomplished including staff orientation and inception, beneficiary selection, and procurement of solar lamps and water wells.
