MABFO hosted meeting of START Network





The Start Network is an international network of humanitarian NGOs, working together to connect people in crisis to the best possible solutions. The Start Fund Committee decided to allocate fund in response to flooding in Bangladesh. As Start Fund is a Network of organisations and not a donor each member of the

project selection group has been nominated by their organisation as a humanitarian expert with local knowledge of the Alert country to select a project proposal for the response. MABFO hosted project selection meeting on 4th August of the START fund's 100th alert. Mr. Md. Enayet Hossain Jakaria, Acting Country Director was one of the member of the selection committee. The most important aspect of this part of the process was that project selection participants attended the selection meeting without their organisational hat on. The idea is that the group objectively review proposals as neutral experts in order to fund the best and select the right proposals for the response. All together 13 organizations submitted proposals for the fund, 6 organizations won among them, MABFO is one of the 6 organizations. Earlier MABFO won the grant of Roanu also from START network for the first time in the history of Muslim Aid in Bangladesh.

3. Healthcare Programme

Muslim Aid's Pabna Community Hospital brought normal life back to 500 patients through free cleft lip surgeries A cleft lip and palate is a type of birth defect that affects the upper lip and roof of the palate. Each cleft lip and

palate operation in our country costs BDT 40,000 to 50,000. Most of the cases poor families of patients are unable to bear the cost finds no other way but to continue to live with the sufferings. People born with the defect is always disregarded in the society for not having normal look and activity. In order to help these poor community Muslim Aid Pabna Community Hospital arranged an expert doctor's team from Dhaka to visit Pabna to operate 40 patients' in August free of cost, led by the head of plastic surgeon of Dhaka Medical College Hospital, Dr. Sajjad Khondokar. Since last 3 years 50 free

cleft lip and palate operation campaigning took place in Pabna Community Hospital; by August 2016 the hospital completed a total 500 operations. The local people, parents of the patients and civil society of Pabna believes that this is for the first time in Bangladesh a community hospital set their 500 patients free from the curse of cleft lip and palate through free humanitarian services. Shoriful Islam a seventh standard student of Lalpur, Nator was not able to talk clearly due to the defect. He was always trying to hide him from the people around. His parents brought him to Muslim Aid Pabna Community Hospital and now after the cleft lip and palate surgery he became a good looking talkative boy. Many people are coming far across the hospital to get their life back to normal with a light of hope in their heart. They wish the hospital will continue their profound services for the poor and

4. Humanitarian Program

4.1 Hygiene kit and cash distribution to 742 cyclone Roanu affected families through project funded by -

(United Methodist Committee on Relief) funded project. The hygiene kit includes –2 bathing soaps, 2 cloth washing soaps, sanitary napkin, 1 aluminum bucket, 10 packet OSR Saline and BDT 4000 cash grant.

4.2 BDT 1,56,80,000 Cash Grant distribution to 1960 beneficiaries through Enhance Resilience programme in partnership with WFP:



Muslim Aid started Enhance Resilience Programme in partnership with WFP from last 12 July, 2016 in Tazumuddin, Bhola and Kalapara Patuakhali. From door to door survey selected total 1960 (PWD 47) beneficiaries, - 1500 from in Tazumuddin, Bhola and 460 Kalapara, Patuakhali. Muslim Aid provided total BDT 1,56,80,000 - BDT 12,000,000 (one crore & twenty lac) unconditional cash grant among 1500 beneficiaries and BDT 3,680,000 (Thirty six lac & eighty thousand) in Kalapara among 460 beneficiaries in two installments. Each participant received BDT 8000 (Eight thousand) in two installments. First distribution Completed from 03-08 August, 2016 and last distribution completed from 05-07 September, 2016.

POVERTY ALLEVIATION-MALEKA MAKES IT SUCCESSFUL

Maleka Begum, hailing from a remote village in the district, has now become a symbol of success, thanks to her ability to think out of the box and persistent efforts. Once hit by financial hardship, the 36-year-old woman from Fulgachh village in Sadar upazila, is now solvent by manufacturing concrete slabs and rings of sanitary latrines.

At present, she earns a profit of around Tk 70,000 per month by selling the rings and slabs, setting an example for other poor villagers -- industry is the key to success. Four years back, the woman and her husband Ramjan Ali of Fulgachh village in Sadar upazila got work as masons for 18 to 20 days in a month. Maleka earned Tk 150-160 while Ramjan got Tk 250-300 per day then. The income they earned was not enough to run the four-member family smoothly, said Maleka, mother of two children. "In 2012, I started manufacturing the latrine rings and slabs with my husband, taking a loan of Tk 20,000 from NGO Muslim Aid Bangladesh and since then we did not need to look back," Maleka Begum said. Her husband has 14 decimals of land. There is a house on five decimals while the rest is being used for her business. In the four years, the woman has saved Tk 5 lakh and become owner of four cows by doing the business. More importantly, she has arranged schooling for her two sons -- Maminul Islam, 13, and Mostakin Islam, 7. She also created job opportunities through the business. Ten local ultra-poor women and five male masons work here everyday. "Around 90 to 100 rings and 20 to 25 slabs are being manufactured here every day. I sell a ring at Tk 350-380 by spending Tk 280-300 and a slab at Tk 500-550 by spending Tk 400-450," said Maleka. However, the same ring is sold at Tk 420-450 and slab at Tk 600-620 in the town, she said, adding that the villagers purchase the rings and slabs for building sanitary latrines at their home. "I sell 60 to 70 rings and 12 to 15 slabs everyday," the woman said, adding that she earns a profit of Tk 2000-2500 after meeting all expenditures every day. Her husband Ramjan helps her in the work. "My wife has brought solvency to our poor family and we are now planning to purchase land and build a brick-built house," he said. Mahiton Bewa, 55, a widow in the village, said she and other ultra-poor women got job in Maleka's firm and they work for Tk 120-150 every day.

Mason Aynal Miah, 42, said he earns Tk 350 from the firm per day. Customers from different villages come here as they can buy the sanitary latrine items at cheaper rate, he said. The NGO's Lalmonirhat Branch Manager Zahedul Islam said the organisation provided loans to Maleka for three terms in easy installment as she tried to bring solvency to her family by doing the business. They are always ready to support with big amount of loan if she wants, he said.
