Through Treaty, Australia's most progressive state, Victoria, is leading the way for the rest of Australia, and starting its run to catch up with New Zealand, Canada and the United States which have all had treaties for hundreds of years.

The tabling of this bill is testament to the skill and determination of the First Peoples Assembly of Victoria, which has shown great dedication in steering the progress of Treaty over many years.

It is also a tribute to the countless Aboriginal people who have fought for justice and a fair go since the first settlers arrived in Victoria - and often despaired of ever achieving it.

The Victorian Government must also be commended for its foresight and the support it has given to Treaty.

Reconciliation Victoria Co-Chairs Professor Andrew Gunstone and Auntie Gina Bundle said:
