VALERIE'S WARTIME IN DIDMARTON.



January



In January it usually snowed, and my heart always leapt with excitement when my grandmother came in to call us, announcing, in her usual manner, "It's a white world." I couldn't wait to see the familiar landscape transformed into a fairyland of pure, virgin whiteness. When I was very small, it would sometimes be over the tops of my Wellington boots, and that, of course, was a legitimate reason for missing school, at least for the morning! Later on, a path would be cleared down the village road, everybody cheerfully wielding their shovels, intent on clearing their bit, and we could go to the grocer's shop for supplies, and, alas, to school. However, we had fun there building snowmen and hurling snowballs at each other.

Sometimes, it was too cold to snow, but ice would form on Joyce's Pool or Oldbury Pond, and we could slide and 'skate'. Nobody had real ice skates, but some used rollers instead, and home-made sledges - usually just a bare plank of wood - added to the fun.

If the temperature dropped quickly after heavy rain, trees, heavily laden with icicles, would come crashing down, blocking roads and pathways, and making people afraid to go out. Luckily, this only happened rarely.

January often arrives with a mix of emotions. For many it signals a fresh start, a moment to reset and look ahead. For others, the long nights and return to routine can feel lonely or heavy after the brightness of the festive season. This is exactly when the strength of our local community matters most.

I was delighted recently to become a Patron of The Churn Project in Cirencester, a charity that has been supporting people of all ages for many years. Whether someone is experiencing isolation, financial pressure, or a lack of confidence and wellbeing, The Churn provides practical help and, just as importantly, human connection. Last year, 1,762 people took part in its activities - an extraordinary testament to what community compassion can achieve. Walking into their building, you immediately feel the warmth and dignity that underpin their work.

The Long Table in Stroud and Cirencester is another wonderful example of that same spirit. I visited recently with my team, and it reinforced how powerful a shared meal can be. By offering dishes on a pay-as-you-can basis, The Long Table ensures that everyone - regardless of circumstances - can enjoy good food and conversation.

New ideas continue to emerge. The Barn Theatre is seeking initial funding for a Barn Bus pilot, which would use school-run vehicles during the day to help older residents travel safely to the theatre and enjoy social time in town. It's a simple but creative way to tackle isolation and expand access to the arts across Tetbury, Fairford, Lechlade and nearby villages.

All these initiatives remind us that wellbeing relies not only on services but on belonging and shared experience. As Parliament progresses the Mental Health Bill, I'll keep pressing for investment in community-led support that prevents crisis before it begins.

Lime Down

Stop Lime Down Meetings full to the rafters at all sites.

Huge crowds packed Malmesbury Town Hall and village halls in the last week of November to get an update on the Lime Down project and to learn how to register their opinions to the Planning Inspectors

The timing of the meetings was appropriate so that people can complete their registration by the January 9 deadline and were encouraged to do so now before Christmas activities take over.

A summary of the project's timeline was given, showing that the project documents have been received by the Planning Inspectors who will take months in 2026 to examine the content. They will also be considering the views of residents and visitors who register and they will ensure that the most important issues are properly examined. The communities were encouraged to list the issues that most affect them from Lime Down. It could be traffic during construction. Malmesbury will bear the brunt of abnormal indivisible loads which, because it was belatedly discovered they could not pass under Kingway Bridge, will be routed from M4 J15 to Cirencester, forcing further alteration to that roundabout, through Crudwell, around Malmesbury, with further roundabout alterations, down through Corston to the site.

Other access routes for HGVs will be via small country lanes like via Grittenham and Burton

Or it may be noise – not just in construction from pile driving for 650,000 panels, but in operation from the hum of cooling fans from substations and battery storage.

Or it could just be the reaction to eighteen square miles of countryside being altered for ever, with 4.5 metre high panels all fenced off and the subsequent loss of public rights of way.

Flooding was a major concern raised by the audience in Corston who were dismayed to hear that this issue has not been properly addressed by Lime Down. Lime Down propose mitigation to protect their assets – but what about residents?

All audiences were dismayed to see again the sheer vast scale of the project but left determined to get their views across.

VICAR'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

'Do not fear' are the first words that the angels say to the Shepherd.

At the start of this New Year we are aware of all the changes that might happen, the threats that worry us and the possibilities that life might throw at us, this year.

And I offer the suggestion that only love or hate, have the power necessary to give us the courage to overcome fear. And rather than speak about hate, I would like to speak about love.

Love is not a given for many people. And the ability to see beyond the fears that close in upon us, is not something everyone thinks that love can help with. But I do not understand how we can see beyond the boundaries of this life, or cope with the knowledge that literally anything can happen to us at anytime, without knowing we are loved unconditionally. And unconditional love is something we only very rarely experience. We do however all have access to it with God.

Our acceptance of God's love requires a religion or a social system of thought and belief, to support it and help it to grow. I am convinced, that whilst things like art, poetry, books, music, gardening, yoga etcetera, all play a huge and important part in the life of the soul, we still need God.

The thing which religion offers is Martin Buber's 'I-Thou' relationship, with God. Our soul needs music frequently - it soothes our restless spirit, and our soul soars when we pick up a paintbrush and respond to the visual world, our mind's imagination is fed by literature and our body stretched by yoga exercises - but I believe we also need something more intimate, a deeper union than can commonly be found in this world, a love which is 100%.

Maybe not everyone is so interested in the love which God offers. But to me, it is vital. And it is the most powerful tool we have, to live life courageously.
