#### **Garden Behaviors**

California Botanic Garden is the largest botanic garden dedicated to California native plants. Many find our Garden to be a special place to visit and bask in the wonders of our native plants and wildlife. To help keep this a special place for everyone to enjoy, our visitors practice these Garden Behaviors.

- 1. <u>Walk only on the paths at all times.</u> Please stay clear of the garden beds to prevent trampling on our plants and do not climb our trees which can be dangerous and harmful to both you and the tree!
- 2. <u>Touch plants only when invited to by your Garden Guide.</u> Plants have defensive adaptations that can hurt us such as thorns and spikes, but they also have non-visible defensive adaptions such as itchy sap!
- Leave things where you found them. It's okay to take a closer look at a fallen acorn or leaf, but please be sure to leave them where you found them to not disrupt the ecosystem. That acorn is food for our squirrels and that leaf will decompose in our soil.
- 4. <u>Admire animals from a distance.</u> Our Garden is home to many animals birds, insects, reptiles, squirrels, rabbits, bobcats, and many more! We like to admire them from a safe distance and keep our food to ourselves.
- 5. <u>Enjoy some quiet time.</u> The secret to spotting some amazing animals and hearing the birds sing is when you walk the paths with voices off. Being mindful of your noise level will allow all our living creatures a chance to enjoy the Garden.

#### **Directions (for Buses):**


Travel north on N College Ave. Enter through the Front Gate, keeping to your left. Turn left at first opportunity (follow painted arrow on ground for *buses*). Park in the yellow bus zone.

### **Directions (for Other Cars/Vehicles):**

Travel north on N College Ave. Enter through the Front Gate, keeping to your left. Continue straight. Park anywhere in the Visitor Parking Lot.


