The Expo also includes informative seminars and workshops, including: a new joint NCRF/Wells Fargo financial literacy workshop, *Think and Grow Rich*, highlighting Wells Fargo's *Hands On Banking Experience*; *Booming Careers: How to Find My Dream Job; Why Attend an HBCU; 411 for the Student-Athlete*, and more.
