Establishes organization's purpose	Supports organization's purpose
Determines strategic direction	Implements strategic plan
Sets major policies	Develops management or implementation-level policies
Hires Executive Director	Hires all support staff
Supports the Executive Director in ongoing operations	Manages the day-to-day operations of the organization
Ultimate power	Immediate power
Accountable to stakeholders	Accountable to board
