Project Construction Concludes in December 2025

The Norfolk-Stanton North Project officially kicked off with a Notice to Construct from Southwest Power Pool on October 10, 2023, advising Nebraska Public Power District (NPPD) to construct a 115 kilovolt (kV) transmission line. The new line would accommodate current and projected future loads and provide additional reliability and enhanced resiliency for the Stanton, Cuming, and Burt County areas. After more than two years of public involvement, easement acquisition, and construction, the transmission line was officially deemed complete in December 2025.

NPPD's consultant Westwood used drones to conduct as-built surveys of the finished line the week of December 15. The remaining tasks include construction crews removing material and equipment from material yards and restoring properties, as needed. Right-of-way agents Neal Dreifurst and Andrew Jarecki are contacting each landowner along the line route to settle any damage that may have occurred to property during construction.

NPPD appreciates the cooperation of the landowners and the public throughout this entire process. As they say, "It takes a village." Thank you to HDR Engineering (engineering services), Dietzel Enterprises Inc. (foundation support), Norfolk Tree Care, LLC (tree clearing), JEO Consulting Group (survey services), Westwood Professional Services (aerial survey services), Irby Utilities (steel poles), Wesco (line conductor), Terracon (soil borings), and to Stanton County Public Power for relocating its distribution line.
