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## Antelope-Holt County 345kV Transmission Line Project

Project Update

### First Round of Open House Meetings Completed

Nebraska Public Power District (NPPD) recently hosted a public open house in Clearwater to introduce and gather input on the planned Antelope-Holt County 345,000-kilovolt (345kV) transmission line. The feedback received during these meetings will be instrumental in determining the transmission line route.

### Public Input Contributes to the Routing Process

NPPD appreciates those who attended the open houses or provided comments through the virtual open house. NPPD's Project Manager Jason Hofer extended his gratitude to attendees and emphasized the importance of their comments. He said the feedback received will play an important role in the routing process.

"The information we receive from landowners about their properties is significant to the transmission line routing process," he said. "The feedback about the current use of the land, as well as future plans for the land, will help determine the most suitable line route."

### Project Overview

The project consists of routing and siting a new 345kV transmission line from NPPD's existing substation in southeast Holt County to the existing substation northeast of Neligh in Antelope County.

### Need and Benefits

Provides enhanced reliability and resiliency for NPPD customers.

Provides for a high-capacity feed into the north central Nebraska area to serve the future projected load levels in the area.

Reduces congestion to support existing and future generation resources in this area.

Meets the projected reliability needs identified in the Southwest Power Pool Integrated Transmission Plan.

Holt County-Antelope 345kV project is the lowest cost and most effective transmission alternative to meet the North American Electric Reliability Corporation reliability standards in this area.
