### TOWN UPDATES

- Last night, the Town held a **special meeting on the Reis Park project** at the Elephant Hotel. It was a productive and informative session, with strong community participation and meaningful input from residents. The meeting provided an opportunity to share updates, answer questions, and hear directly from the community as we continue to shape this project to reflect the needs of Somers.
- The **Town/County tax deadline has passed**, and the Tax Office remains available to assist residents with any follow-up needs.
- Town staff continue to work closely across departments and with regional partners to address day-to-day operations and ensure services are delivered efficiently and reliably for residents.

### PROJECTS & PROGRESS

Coordination and planning continue for the **Route 202 culvert project**, with the Town actively working with the **NYS Department of Transportation (DOT)** and local stakeholders. Efforts remain focused on addressing potential impacts, improving traffic management, and ensuring the project is carried out safely and efficiently. A follow-up meeting with DOT is scheduled for **May 12**, during which the Town will continue to advocate for solutions that reduce disruption and keep residents informed throughout the process. Construction is anticipated to begin in **late June, following the close of the school year**, to help minimize impact on traffic and daily routines.
