TOWN UPDATES

This week, approximately **50 residents** attended the public information meeting at the **Heritage Hills Community Center** regarding the upcoming **Route 202 culvert repair project**. Representatives from the Town, including the **Supervisor, Police, Fire, Highway Department, and Heritage Hills leadership**, were on hand to discuss the project and address questions and concerns. Residents received an overview of the project timeline, expected impacts, and plans to manage traffic and maintain public safety during construction. Town officials emphasized their commitment to minimizing disruptions, coordinating with the **NYS DOT**, and keeping residents informed throughout the project. An additional public informational meeting, open to all residents, will be held on **6/3/26 at 6PM** at the **Heritage Hills Comm Ctr**.

PROJECTS & PROGRESS

While many Town projects receive public attention once construction begins, a significant amount of work takes place long before the first shovel enters the ground. Engineering reviews, environmental assessments, permitting, site analysis, and coordination among multiple agencies are all critical steps that help ensure projects are completed responsibly and efficiently. A site walk for the **Reis Park project** is scheduled for **June 8, 2026**, as Town representatives, consultants, and project professionals continue refining plans during the design phase. These behind-the-scenes efforts transform community input, planning, and vision into a project that will serve residents for generations to come.
