PROJECTS & PROGRESS

Inside Town Hall - One of the realities of local government is balancing the unexpected with the work already planned. The recent storm required departments to shift their attention to emergency response and cleanup, but the everyday work of government never stops. Road maintenance, park operations, inspections, capital projects, planning initiatives, and resident services continue every day, even as crews complete the remaining storm cleanup.

TOWN UPDATES

The Route 202/Warren Street Culvert Replacement Project continues to make steady progress.

I met this week with the project's construction manager, who confirmed the project remains on schedule to reopen Route 202 before the start of the school year. Next week, crews are expected to remove the existing culvert and begin excavating the roadway, marking one of the most significant phases of construction.

While the road closure has required patience and adjustments, many residents have settled into the temporary traffic pattern, recognizing that this inconvenience is temporary and will result in a stronger, more resilient roadway for years to come.

As a reminder, the pedestrian bridge remains open throughout construction, providing safe access across the project area.
