COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT | JEFF ZIMMERMANN DAY

At Thursday night's Town Board meeting, the Town recognized longtime resident Jeff Zimmermann for his years of service to Somers and the Somers Historical Society.

Jeff has used his technological and creative talents to help preserve and share Somers' history. During the COVID-19 pandemic, he helped produce and broadcast videos of community events so residents could remain connected. He has also been a dedicated steward of our historic properties, particularly Mt. Zion Church and the Wright-Reis Homestead. Most recently, Jeff received the Westchester County District 2 Volunteer Award in recognition of his service. In appreciation for the countless hours he has given to our community, the Town Board proclaimed Saturday, September 5, 2026, as Jeff Zimmermann Day in the Town of Somers.

AROUND TOWN | ROUTE 202 IS OPEN

After a summer of construction and detours, Route 202 reopened to traffic Tuesday, just in time for the start of the school year. The Town's 1917 Ford Model T made the first trip across the new culvert before Route 202 reopened to traffic. The road is open, the detours are behind us, and traffic is moving again.
