

SMALL GROUP BIBLE STUDY FAO

WHAT IS LIFELIGHT?

LifeLight is an in-depth Bible Study published by Concordia Publishing House. It is designed for congregations to study together in large and small groups.

WHO IS INVITED?

Anyone interested in the Bible and Christian doctrine is welcome, but typically post-high school ages attend. The studies are geared towards those who already have a confirmation-level understanding of Scripture. No pressure, no tests, no judgments.

WHAT IS THE TIME COMMITMENT?

Each study is 9 weeks long (the schedule is publicized). Think of it like a bowling/golf league: you can attend what you wish, but for the most personal benefit you should make it a priority.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

We will gather at 6 PM at the school for 5-10 minutes of worship. For the next hour, you will split up into smaller groups for discussion. At the end, we will gather together again for a 20-30 minute summary lecture. We will end no later than 8 PM.

IS THERE A COST?

\$15 covers the cost of the book and provides a slush fund for sundries.

IS THERE CHILDCARE?

Yes. High school youth members will be paid to provide childcare on site.

OLD TESTAMENT READING

Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-9 (ESV)

¹ "And now, O Israel, listen to the statutes and the just decrees that I am teaching you, and do them, that you may live, and go in and take possession of the land that the LORD, the God of your fathers, is giving you. ² You shall not add to the word that I command you, nor take from it, that you may keep the commandments of the LORD your God that I command you.

⁶Keep them and do them, for that will be your wisdom and your understanding in the sight of the peoples, who, when they hear all these statutes, will say, 'Surely this great nation is a wise and understanding people.' ⁷ For what great nation is there that has a god so near to it as the LORD our God is to us, whenever we call upon him? ⁸ And what great nation is there, that has statutes and just decrees so righteous as all this law that I set before you today?

9 "Only take care, and keep your soul diligently, lest you forget the things that your eyes have seen, and lest they depart from your heart all the days of your life. Make them known to your children and your children's children."

EPISTLE READING Ephesians 6:10-20 (ESV)

¹⁰ Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. ¹¹ Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. ¹² For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. 13 Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. 14 Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, 15 and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace. ¹⁶ In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one; ¹⁷ and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God, 18 praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints, ¹⁹ and also for me, that words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel, ²⁰ for which I am an ambassador in chains, that I may declare it boldly, as I ought to speak.

HOLY GOSPEL Mark 7:14-23 (ESV)

¹⁴ And he called the people to him again and said to them, "Hear me, all of you, and understand: ¹⁵ There is nothing outside a person that by going into him can defile him, but the things that come out of a person are what defile him." ¹⁷ And when he had entered the house and left the people, his disciples asked him about the parable. ¹⁸ And he said to them, "Then are you also without understanding? Do you not see that whatever goes into a person from outside cannot defile him, ¹⁹ since it enters not his heart but his stomach, and is expelled?" (Thus he declared all foods clean.) ²⁰ And he said, "What comes out of a person is what defiles him. ²¹ For from within, out of the heart of man, come evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, ²² coveting, wickedness, deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride, foolishness. ²³ All these evil things come from within, and they defile a person."
