

## At a Glance

In 2023, we served 202 clients from 33 countries. Of those whose cases were completed in 2023, 88% received a positive outcome.

Without representation, asylum seekers face an average success rate of only 8% or less.

Many of these clients are detained at the Imperial Regional Detention Facility and the Otay Mesa Detention Facility or reside in San Diego County while their case is being processed.



SCIP is dedicated to delivering services to survivors of human rights violations by providing pro bono legal representation to immigrants.




## ABOUT US

SCIP was founded in 2015 to address the growing needs of detained and non-detained African and LGBTQ+ asylum seekers in Southern California who are fleeing persecution. Our clients rarely have family in the United States and have no way to pay for representation. SCIP provides them with the security of compassionate legal advocacy during the complicated and everchanging immigration process.



## WHY SCIP?

Tens of thousands of immigrants in the U.S. face deportation back to countries with unstable governments either unwilling or unable to protect its citizens. If returned, they face the immediate danger of physical harm or direct threats to their lives. Because undocumented immigrants do not have the right to an appointed immigration attorney, the majority of them concede to deportation because they cannot afford representation. SCIP's mission is to give those seeking safety and stability in the U.S. a chance at a new and productive life.



## CALL TO ACTION

Changes in presidential administrations lead to instability in immigration funding. In recent years, immigration policies have adversely affected the rights of asylum seekers, necessitating a demand for legal representation.
