LIMMUD FSU THROUGH NUMBERS

In 2023, we hosted the third Limmud FSU Europe event in Berlin, with 800 participants from 25 countries. In Baku, Azerbaijan, we brought together 300 participants. The event in Lublin, Poland, united 150 attendees from Ukraine for a conference on Jewish learning and offering support. Meanwhile, in Tel Aviv, 150 volunteers gathered for a special event to address the challenges in the time of war. Additionally, we hosted a series of communal and leadership development events around the globe, underscoring our commitment to community, Jewish learning and the State of Israel.

LIMMUD FSU BERLIN

Approximately 800 Jews from across Germany and 24 other countries, including Sweden, Portugal, Spain, Finland, the UK, Israel, and the USA, attended the third Limmud FSU Europe conference. This was the first-ever event of its kind held in Berlin. Among the participants were 50 Limmudniks from Ukraine, some of whom still reside in the embattled country, while others have sought refuge from the war in Israel and various parts of central and western Europe.

The conference featured 130 sessions covering diverse topics such as bringing Nazi criminals to justice, exploring the concept of the afterlife in Jewish thought, examining how Jewish history is taught in different countries, and discussing the Jewish tradition's stance on war. Workshops on creating perfumes, a review of Jewish women who served as models for masterpiece works of art, the revival of the Hebrew language, and Israel dancing were also included. Artistic performances featured the Ukrainian hip-hop group FO SHO, whose members are Ukrainian-Ethiopian Jews originally from Kharkiv.











LIMMUD FSU BAKU

For the second time in only nine months, 300 Jews in Baku had the opportunity to participate in a Limmud FSU conference. The program offered a wide range of topics, including design, marketing, cybersecurity, ecology, Israel, psychology, law, the history of Jewish communities in Azerbaijan, and the fate of Jews in the Caucasus Mountains during the Holocaust. Art workshops focused on decorating dishes, painting on glass, making jewelry, and exploring Azerbaijani wines, among others.

One of the main event speakers was Israel's ambassador to Azerbaijan, George Deek, who discussed the relationship between the two countries. He emphasized the importance of a strong military, a vibrant economy, and good friends for a country's success, highlighting Azerbaijan as one of Israel's closest allies.











LIMMUD FSU UKRAINE

In Lublin, Poland, 150 Jews from various cities in Ukraine gathered for the Limmud FSU Ukraine conference on Jewish learning. This event was particularly significant due to the backdrop of the ongoing war in Ukraine and the war Israel is fighting against Hamas in the Gaza Strip.

Sessions ranged from a photographic presentation of the war in Ukraine to an evening of stories written during that war. Other topics included famous Jews from Ukraine, discussions about the release of hostages in Jewish classical sources, and a lecture on the city's 600 years of Jewish history. Additionally, participants had the opportunity to visit the Majdanek Nazi concentration and death camp located just outside the city. The conference provided important informal opportunities for attendees to discuss the ongoing wars in Israel and Ukraine, support each other, and decompress.











LIMMUD FSU ISRAEL

Following the ongoing war in Israel since October 7th, there was a strong desire for unity, emotional support, and understanding of the situation through relevant learning. In Tel Aviv, 150 volunteers from Limmud FSU Israel gathered for a special event that served as both a heartwarming statement of resilience and a commitment to mutual support during times of war.

The event offered sessions and discussions on topics such as the global rise of antisemitism, antisemitism on US college campuses, the reasons why the Holocaust has become a central theme in discussions about the war, and the role of the UN and the Red Cross in the legal aspects of the war. The program also included art masterclasses to express feelings and support, as well as cultural performances that addressed the events and experiences of the war.












LIMMUD FSU CANADA

The Jewish community in Canada, and Limmud FSU Canada team among them, expressed unwavering support for Israel in response to the ongoing war. In the aftermath of the October 7th events, several volunteers from Limmud FSU Canada traveled to Israel to serve in the IDF reserves. Despite facing unprecedented antisemitism, Limmud FSU volunteers continued to organize various Jewish and Israel support events.

These initiatives included donations, support sessions, participation in solidarity rallies for the hostages, "Stand with Israel" Shabbat dinners for 65 participants, featuring a talk by educator Yuliya Etingen about her visit to two kibbutzim that were heavily impacted during the Hamas invasion, as well as Hanukkah learning and celebrations for 50 participants. The main message conveyed was that despite the challenges posed by the war in Israel and antisemitism around the world, the community remained committed to studying and celebrating Judaism and the State of Israel.
