Why do we work on Sexual Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) in fragile areas?

In conflict-prone and fragile contexts, women and young girls in particular are highly vulnerable. They are continuously confronted with aggression and violence throughout society, with little to no protection against assaults. And in an environment in which Sexual Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) are neither addressed nor recognized.

What is the goal of Jeune S3?

We aim to ensure that young people (including the most marginalized and vulnerable populations - especially girls between the ages of 10 and 14) are able, motivated and have the opportunity to make informed choices about their sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR) and that their sexual and reproductive rights are respected.

We work with and for young people as they are the main actors of their own lives. By 2020, Jeune S3 aims to reach **1,5 million young people** via health and rights education sessions.

- Youth voice and confidence
- SRHR knowledge and skills
- Responsive SRHR services
- Enabling environment and respect of rights

We develop and distribute Comprehensive Sexual Education (CSE) tools for in and out of school youth



We organize Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights radio programs by youth for youth



We train youth to become leaders of their communities



We empower youth to advocate for their Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights



We develop inter-faith tools to educate and empower religious leaders with the necessary information to better support young people regarding their Sexual and Reproductive Health



We develop and strengthen youth friendly services



We amplify the voice of the youth to national, regional and international levels



With appropriate trainings, we facilitate discussions on Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights between young people



We promote inter-generational dialogues and safe spaces



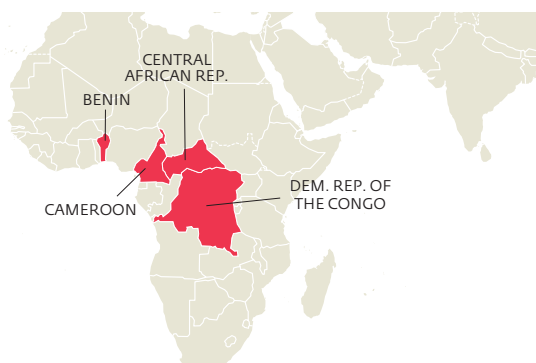
We empower key populations (sex workers, LGBT communities, etc) to claim their rights and protect themselves
