Welcome to St Mark's this 'Pentecost Sunday.'

One of the great privileges of the Christian life is to receive God's Holy Spirit. As Peter says to the crowds in Acts 2:38, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." But what exactly does the Spirit do? What difference does He make?

Much could be said! One helpful summary of the Holy Spirit's present work is that He *applies* the salvation Christ *accomplished*: He is saving, gathering, transforming and empowering His people. Here are a few important things we learn about the Holy Spirit from these early chapters of Acts:

- 1. The coming of the Spirit is a sign that God's long-promised kingdom has dawned, and that Jesus is the risen King and Saviour of all. Peter quotes from the Old Testament prophet Joel: "in the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit upon all people" (Acts 2:17, quoting Joel 2:28). If the Spirit is here, it means it is the 'last days'. And the Spirit is here because he has been poured out by King Jesus.
- 2. God's Spirit is given to all who trust in Christ. In the Old Testament, God's Spirit was only given to specific individuals, often only to empower specific tasks. But now, everyone who turns to Christ is promised "you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit". So, if you are in Christ, then the Spirit is in you; and as there is only one Spirit, so whatever gender, age or background, we are all equal and united in him.
- 3. God's Spirit empowers mission and ministry to all. In Acts 1:8, Jesus promised "you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and you will be my witnesses... to the ends of the earth." In our reading today, Peter and the apostles, empowered by the Holy Spirit boldly proclaim the news of Jesus even in the face of opposition, threat, imprisonment and beating. So for us, if we long to see the gospel go forth to many in 'Bassendean and beyond,' what an encouragement to know God has given us his Spirit to empower us to be his witnesses.

"Lord, please pour out your Spirit afresh on us to empower us for the mission and ministries you may call us to, that many others may call on the name of the Lord and be brought to salvation and maturity in him."

Jireh Uganda

Jireh Uganda is a small, grassroots organisation where programs are planned and implemented at local village level. Though small in scale, Jireh Uganda programs are changing the lives of hundreds of impoverished Ugandan villagers and bringing glory to Jesus.

Destitute families are gifted a pregnant sow, a goat or three chickens, providing food and an income source. Some of the piglets, goat kids and chicks must be passed onto other needy families. A small maize farming program provided several families on the brink of starvation with a sustainable livelihood.

Small business cooperatives of three or four impoverished villagers are transformative. Examples include chapati making, selling legumes, milk or local produce. Vocational skills programs in tailoring, hairdressing and motor bike mechanics are bringing a hope and a future to many unemployed, unskilled villagers.
