## Out to In

Brothers and sisters,

Have you had the experience of being excluded, on the outer, not 'in'? Or perhaps have you had the experience of going from being excluded, to being included, accepted, welcomed, on the 'in'? Wherever there is more than one person, we will find this situation – either being 'in', or 'out', relationally included or excluded. Where would you say you are with God – out, or in, excluded, or welcomed?

In our Acts reading today we meet someone who was on the 'outer' of God's people: an "Ethiopian eunuch". As an Ethiopian, he was from a distant place, and of a different race. As a eunuch, he was physically impaired and specifically excluded from full membership in the Old Covenant people of God. But, now Jesus has come...

The Holy Spirit sends Philip to a random road in the wilderness – but He has a plan, that Philip would meet this Ethiopian eunuch. The man is reading from Isaiah 53, the famous passage which speaks of the Suffering Servant who was 'pierced for our transgressions'. And beginning with that very passage of Scripture, Philip tells him the good news about Jesus. Jesus the Messiah suffered, for our iniquities, to bring us peace with God. He has borne the sin of many, and his cleansing blood sprinkles many nations (Isaiah 53:5; 12; 52:13). Wonderfully, the Ethiopian eunuch believes in Jesus, is baptised, and "went on his way rejoicing".

The Bible is very clear that our sin distances us from God who is holy and pure. Our sin separates us from right relationship with a righteous God. We deserve to be 'on the outer' for all eternity. But Jesus has borne the suffering we deserve, to bring us near to God. And that is an offer for everyone everywhere: you, me, our family members and friends and colleagues and neighbours, and for those in distant places and different races. That by his grace we might be forgiven our sins and fully included in relationship with God.

As we'll sing today,
"Now my debt is paid, it is paid in full,
By the precious blood that my Jesus spilled,
Now the curse of sin has no hold on me,
Whom the Son sets free, oh, is free indeed!"

# MISSION PROJECT UPDATE Information for your Prayers



## **Scripture Union**

Over a decade ago, a Northern Territory church leader had an idea: a camp program for the children of her remote area to hear about God's big story. Although that leader has since passed away, her legacy lives on in Bush Camp.

In an area where kids' clubs are non-existent, Bush Camp is helping children and young people encounter God's word.

The camp takes young people out of the day-to-day and on a Biblical journey through the stories of God creating the world and, at the most recent camp, the story of Moses. Bible stories are shared in Kriol by local leaders, alongside games and memory verses.

Although the camp is led moment to moment, planning for the teaching happens ahead of time, at the Indigenous Leaders Training Weekend in Katherine.

"We spent all weekend in the shade of a massive tree . . . Every mention of trees and roots, especially Psalm 1, now has far more meaning," reflects Andrew Beavers, SU Australia Camping and Missions Specialist.

While training under a tree has its technological challenges, relationships flourished, and these leaders were equipped to support their young people in local communities with relevant, bespoke training.

Thanks for being a part of making ministry in these most remote spaces possible by equipping and releasing local leaders and volunteers to serve.
