Are You a Convert Like Saul?

The radical nature of the conversion of Saul on the Damascus Road is justly famous and has enormous implications for all Christians.

Ordinary people like us however are skilled in self-excuse. We are not Jews nor Pharisees and certainly not religious fanatics as was this man. Moreover, we have never had a conversion experience like his, the appearance of the exalted Jesus from heaven. As such we can hardly expect to hear the Lord sending us out as disciples to foreign places or peoples at risk to our lives.

Who in their right mind would embrace call, like mine, to keep going to Myanmar (Jan 2026 is next) with its intestinal parasites (e.g. my recent Jan 25 acquisition of H. Pylori and Amoeba), and with armed soldiers at street corners? What then motivated a well-educated scholar (Acts 22:3; Phil 3) to reach out to sinful ritually unclean Gentiles (Gal 2:15)? Paul's actions were always controversial. But why?

The simplest explanation is that he was transformed by grace from being the "foremost of sinners" (1 Tim 1:15) and sent by Jesus Christ to live in his likeness (1 Cor 11:1). Are you familiar with this old question, "If you were put on trial for being a Christian would there be enough evidence to convict you?" Paul can boast against his adversaries, "From now on, don't let anyone trouble me with these things. For I bear on my body the scars that show I belong to Jesus." (Gal 6:17).

The key to Paul is his experience of radical grace. "by the *grace* of God I am what I am, and his *grace* to me was not without effect…I worked harder than all the other apostles, yet not I, but the *grace* of God that was with me." (1 Cor 15:10). He knew he was chosen before the world was made (Eph 1:4) and that Christ's "*grace* is sufficient… for power is made perfect in weakness."" (2 Cor 12:9). Attributing all to grace, the apostle leaves no room for our petty excuses.

The major lesson for St Mark's from the call and conversion of Saul is, "Will we accept the grace of the Gospel to reach out to the social outcastes / "tax collectors and sinners" as Paul did in the likeness of the One who called him so powerfully on the Damascus Rd? Will we go to those outside the gathered Church rather than expecting them to come to us. Have we a Spirit-filled passion that the lost become for the crucified Jesus "trophies of grace"!

MISSION PROJECT UPDATE Information for your Prayers



Bible Society

In Big Kids Sunday School recently we discussed how the good news of Jesus' death and resurrection could go to 'the ends of the earth' as Jesus commanded. Some suggested they go themselves and we discussed the need to learn a different language in order to share the good news. Then someone suggested sending them bibles, but they needed to be translated into other languages, so we talked about the work of the Bible Society here and overseas.

The Bible Societies have teams made up of speakers of the language plus others knowledgeable in bible language who work together with Bible Society's consultants to translate the bible into other languages. It's an exacting process.

"I told my sister. 'I'm not good at translating in Iwaija". Serina recalls. "Then she encouraged me, 'Well, if God is giving you this work, he's ahead of you and he will direct you." Serina was one of many who gathered in Darwin for a Bible translator's workshop at Nungalinya College in November 2024. This workshop saw nearly 50 translators from 16 different language groups represented.

In 2024, Bible Society Australia and Wycliffe Bible Translators collaborated to establish a state-of-the-art video recording studio to produce Auslan Bible resources for the Australian Deaf community.
