#### Jesus Lord of Time

At the conclusion of the finale of the Bible, Jesus says: ""Look, I am coming soon! My reward is with me, and I will give to each person according to what they have done. <sup>13</sup> I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End." (Rev 22:12-13)

We often forget, in our unbelief and rush, that Jesus, for whom and through whom all things were made, including time, is the sovereign Lord of time (Col 1:16). Whilst philosophers, from the ancient Greeks through the medieval Moslems and Catholic Schoolmen, have often reflected on *The Timelessness of God*" (the title of my Ph. D publication), few have written on Jesus as Lord of time. This is however a topic of the most intense pastoral importance.

It was Christ who taught us with great poise, ""Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. <sup>29</sup> Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." (Matt 11:28-29).

Time is a fallen creature now perfectly redeemed through the death and resurrection of Christ . The glorification of Jesus' humanity by death, resurrection and ascension into the realm of God has brought time into its God-ordained perfect rest. The first order of creation, "God saw all that he had made, and it was very good. And there was evening, and there was morning—the sixth day....God had finished the work he had been doing; so on the seventh day he rested from all his work. <sup>3</sup> Then God blessed the seventh day and made it holy" (Gen 1:31ff), finds its fulfilment, "in the fullness of time" (Gal 4:4) into which Jesus came to put to death all our broken temporality. The triumphant cry, "It is finished" (John 19:30) i.e. perfected, points to a resurrection where the man Jesus returns to the glory he had in eternity with his Father (John 17:1-5). In death the Holy Spirit preserved his body from all decay and freed it from the ongoing power of mortality (Ps 16:10: Acts 2:27), in resurrection-ascension the old age of fallenness was lifted up into the eternal order of divine life.

In Jesus, resurrected and glorified, a new aeon exists where the old time of mourning and sorrow has forever passed away (Rev 21:4). This new creation order (2 Cor 5:17) is an integral part of the Gospel message. A message, given that its centre and circumference is the Person of JESUS, that can be proclaimed by old and young alike all authority from the one who raised Jesus so emphatically from the dead, the blessed Holy Spirit (Acts 1:8; Rom 8:11).
