For He is Good

There's a call and response often used in the African and African-American churches, where the leader says, "God is good," and the people respond, "all the time;" and the leader says, "all the time", and the people respond, "God is good". What I love about that – often on the lips of brothers and sisters in extreme hardship, suffering and persecution – is how it captures that we can affirm God's goodness not only when things in my life are going 'well' – but all the time.

As the Psalms keep repeating, we can "Give thanks to the Lord, for he *is good*, his love endures forever." (Psalm 105, 106, 107, 118; 136!) We can "give thanks in all circumstances", not because they are always good, but because even in bad circumstances, God is always good. God is perfectly, completely, utterly and always good. There is never any evil, wickedness, or impurity in God. No, God is good, all the time.

God's goodness is displayed in billions of ways in his creation and preservation of our world and our lives, but there is no greater display of God's goodness than in Jesus. Jesus "went around doing good" (Acts 10:38) as in compassion he healed the sick, cast out evil spirits, fed the hungry, and taught the lost. Even more: his goodness took him to the cross, to lay down his life in the greatest act of goodness, the good giving his life to rescue the bad (Romans 5:6-8).

This is not to make light of our hardships and sufferings. Evil is real, much is 'not good' in our world and lives. We look in hope for the day when sin, suffering, Satan and death are defeated and all things made new. But just as God used the greatest evil (Jesus' death) for the greatest good (salvation of all), so in God's good hands he promises to "work all things for the good of those who love him" (Rom 8:28).

Brothers and sisters, come to Jesus to "taste and see that the Lord is good, blessed in the one who takes refuge in him" (Ps 34:8). And if we know his goodness, his will for us by his Spirit is to do good. Christ "gave himself for us to redeem us from all wickedness and to purify for himself a people that are his very own, eager to do what is good" (Titus 2:13–14).
