Will Not the Judge of All the World Do Right?

In our reading in Genesis today, we come to Genesis 18-19, the famous – or rather infamous – account of Sodom and Gomorrah. It is not pleasant reading. Earlier in Genesis, we read that Abraham's nephew Lot and his family had separated from Abraham and gone to live in Sodom (Genesis 13:10-13). But whatever economic advancement might be found there, Sodom was not a place for moral advancement. In the narrative, God has heard "the outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah is so great and their sin is so grievous" (Gen 18:20) and, like a detective tipped off, sends two angels to investigate. What the angels find confirms the reports in the gravest way: no fear of God or concern for others, but desire for exploitation, hurt and sexual immorality (Gen 19:4-9). The angels rescue Lot and his immediate family, and God destroys Sodom and Gomorrah (Gen 19:24-25). In all this, God the judge does what is right (Gen 18:25).

Firstly, God does, and will do, what is right in punishing sin. The Apostle Peter wrote that "[God] condemned the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah by burning them to ashes and made them an example of what is going to happen to the ungodly" (2 Peter 2:6). One of the oldest lies of Satan is that God won't punish sin ("you will not surely die" said the serpent!). This past historic event teaches us that God will act, in perfect truth and justice, to rightly punish sin in the future. Jesus and his apostles consistently called people to repentance before the day of God's wrath. Have we?

Secondly, God does, and will do, what is right in rescuing the righteous. Again, Peter writes, "and if he [God] rescued Lot, a righteous man... then the Lord knows how to rescue the godly from trials" (2 Peter 2:6,9). God will not treat the righteous like the unrighteous. We see that God not only punishes, but also rescues. Lot is rescued because of his 'comparative' righteousness (he wasn't as bad as the people of Sodom), and Abraham's intercession for him (Gen 18:16-33; 19:29). In God's kindness, we who repent of our sin and turn to Jesus are clothed with his righteousness, and have no less than Jesus himself interceding for us (Rom 8:33-34)! Do you know this hope found only in "Jesus, who rescues from the coming wrath" (1 Thess 1:10)?

Scripture Union Australia

In an age of phones, screens, and digital distraction devices galore, reading and attention levels are said to be dropping, not just among young people, but among adults too.

And yet we know that God's word is active and living and has a message for all of us when we take the time to listen and explore. One of Scripture Union Australia's core activities is Christian Education in Schools. In the most recent edition of SU News (available in the hall) volunteers around Australia share the challenges and joys of sharing the gospel message and helping young people connect in ways that meet them where they're at.

Read about how school volunteers in the ACT are showing kids the Bible is far from boring, and how kids in the NT are begging for more Bible stories during lunchtime craft sessions.

Even as the volunteers serve the children, they also receive:

"Being in the school with the Aboriginal students and trying to think about how to share in culturally appropriate ways, has taught me to read the Bible from a perspective that is closer to the original culture than my own, resulting in my faith being changed in the process," reflects a SU Australia worker.
