Dear brothers and sisters,

The Sacrifice of the Beloved Son

What would you sacrifice for God? And do you know what God has sacrificed for you? In our readings in Genesis, today we come to one of the most moving accounts in the Bible. Last week (Genesis 21) we saw how God keeps his promise to miraculously give Abraham and Sarah a son, Isaac. But now (Genesis 22), God "tests" Abraham, and asks Abraham to go to Mount Moriah and sacrifice Isaac as a burnt offering. It's a gut-wrenching narrative, as they go, and walk up the mountain, and Abraham is about to do it – when God intervenes and provides a ram instead for the sacrifice. Abraham 'passes' the test; he shows he "fears God" (v.12), trusting and obeying God even to be willing to sacrifice his only, beloved Son.

In the fullness of the Bible – especially apt as we move towards Christmas – we read of how God the Father gives his "one and only Son" (John 3:16); "whom I [God] love" (Matt 3:17). Like Isaac, Jesus carries the wood up the mountain; but unlike Isaac he knows where he goes, he goes willingly, and he is not spared. "The LORD will provide" – *Jehovah Jireh* - and he has in the most costly, magnificent way, providing his Son, for our salvation.

We too are called to sacrifice for God. When obeying God's word feels difficult and costly, be reminded how much God has sacrificed for us. "He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all, how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things?" (Rom 8:32)

Preparing for the Son

Yes, can you believe it, Advent starts next Sunday! A question to ask is, how can I/we make the most of Advent as a time of looking to Christ? In particular, before Advent starts you may like to consider getting an Advent book or devotional you could read. These days there are many great resources at Koorong or Reformers bookshops, or for download - here are a couple I'd recommend:
