About the Sponsorship Level Names:

Making Democracy Work sponsorship levels are named after trailblazing women that inspire and empower the League of Women Voters of New Jersey's work. We are proud to honor them.

Dr. Deborah Ann Turner: *20th President of the League of Women Voters of the United States, Deborah Ann Turner was a fearless advocate for voting and women's rights. She devoted her life to empowering voters across the nation. As a gynecologist, teacher, and associate medical director for Planned Parenthood of the North Central States, Dr. Turner fought for a more compassionate, representative, and equitable union. The League continues our work in her memory.*

Sojourner Truth: *An African American abolitionist and women's rights activist, Sojourner Truth delivered her famous "Ain't I a Woman?" speech at the Ohio Women's Rights Convention in 1851.*

Florence Peshine Eagleton: *Founder of the League of Women Voters of New Jersey and a leader in the women's suffrage movement, Florence Peshine Eagleton established the Eagleton Institute of Politics at Rutgers University through a generous bequest.*

Ida B. Wells-Barnett: *African American suffragist, sociologist, journalist and early leader in the civil rights movement, Ida B. Wells-Barnett formed the National Association of Colored Women and the Women's Era Club, the first civic organization for African American women.*

Adelina Otero-Warren: *The first Hispanic woman to run for U.S. Congress, Adelina Otero-Warren was a leader in New Mexico's women's suffrage movement and advocated for suffrage materials to be published in both English and Spanish.*
