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Deep Hope:

To know HIM... and how that changes EVERYTHING!



Long Term Learning Targets:

- O I can explain how Old Testament Narrative, Poetry, or Prophecy points toward Jesus Christ in the New Testament.
- I can demonstrate how a disciple can become a worshipper of God by participating in God's call to go into all the world and proclaiming the Gospel to those who need to hear it.



Curricular Outcomes:

(There are no State requirements for this curriculum.)

Park Christian School requires:

That Jesus be "proclaimed and seen in every book of the OT"

That students "understand their own sinful nature and need for a Savior"

That students "become familiar with impacting characters and events of the Old Testament"

Habit(s) of Learning:

Courageous Designing- Students will design their own tract, video (with QR Code for sharing in person or on social media), or graphic novel. They will choose an Old Testament story, A psalm or poetry and describe how it points to Jesus, utilize this theme to present the Gospel and use this to invite someone to church, connect, learn more.

God Worshipping- Students will extend their talents artisically to express the glory of God and His attributes in a soluble and comprehensive way so as for people to get further connected via social media, church fellowship, youth group and other means of discipleship.



See God's Story:

I want my students to see that the Old Testament has meaning and significance not only as it points to Christ and a deeper relationship with Him, but also how and what God did to win our hearts!

Throughlines:

Servant Working- Students will use their video, tract or graphic novel to invite people to church, engage in conversation, and present the gospel to neighbors, friends and family and the unchurched.

Image Reflecting- Students will extend their heart and talents to engage all manners of people as they delight in the image of God inherent to all of God's created people.



Formational Learning Experience:

Real needs: Students engaged in outreach!

Real people: Neighbors, the Lost, unsaved, unchurched

Real work: Give students the opportunity to witness, share the Gospel, invite someone to church, or connect. This will give individuals the preliminary steps to create relationships and doors for discipleship.



INVITE

 Students were presented the details of the FLFx in class and were invited to participate in a full class production of a video on how the Story of Joseph, the Cupbearer and Baker in prison points to Jesus. This would serve as an example to them in their own personal projects. Students eagerly involved themselves in the costume design, script writing, filming, and editing and production of the class video.
