Deep Hope:

Our deep hope is that we would become ***established*** in our faith so that we might grow to become ***equipped*** for our God-given purpose by being diligent students of the Word of God and faithful followers of Jesus Christ.

Long Term Learning Targets:

- 🎯 I can explain major Christian doctrines with accuracy and detail.
- 🎯 I can discuss and defend my beliefs.
- 🎯 I can share the Gospel with someone else through the use of Scripture and personal testimony.

Habit(s) of Learning:

Joy-filled collaborating: Students worked together to research and develop a presentation on *Response to Sin*, in which they explored the definition and problem of sin, God's response, and man's response.

Gracious communicating: Students partnered up to share their faith with children/teens in a real-life setting, in an age-appropriate manner that would make an impact.



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See God's Story:

We are ALL created in God's image, and His desire is that every person come to know Him. That is why it is so important that we do not keep the gospel message to ourselves.	We have all sinned, and have need of a Savior. This understanding is paramount for the understanding and reception of the gospel (for ourselves and others.)	There is hope in Jesus Christ. By sharing our story, we can lead others to this hope.	As believers, we can participate in God's restoration by spreading the message of salvation to others.

Storyline:

“Lead me in your love to those around me.”

Students were encouraged to see others the way God sees them, love them the way God loves them, and be willing and ready to share their stories and the Good News of Jesus with them out of that love.





Throughlines:

Christ Following- Students learned to better articulate their experience of salvation and explain what it means to them to follow Christ.

Kingdom Seeking- Students explored the mandate of the Great Commission & investigated various ways to share the gospel with others.



Formational Learning Experience:

Real needs: the need to hear the gospel in a way they can understand/accept

Real people: Children attending Colegio Bautista Belen

Real work: Students led activities, songs, and crafts, and shared the gospel through different direct means.

Students were invited to contribute to the conversation about evangelism by sharing their own experiences and knowledge of the Gospel and the need for evangelism through their group projects on “Response to Sin.”



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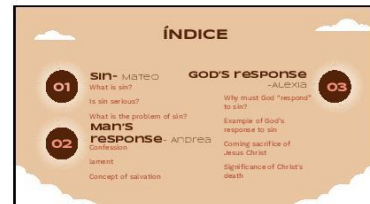

GOD'S RESPONSE

EXAMPLES OF GOD'S RESPONSE TO SIN

The fall of Adam and Eve: When Adam and eve ate the forbidden fruit, God gave them consequences yet he showed mercy by providing a future savior. (Genesis 3)

The Flood: People's wickedness reached such a level that God decided to destroy earth with a flood. But he showed mercy through the ark by saving Noah and other animals. (Genesis 6-9)

DISCUSSION OF THE CONCEPT OF SALVATION

ILLUSTRATION	DEFINITION FROM SCRIPTURE
	John 3:16 "For this is how God loved the world: He gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life."
	Romans 10:9-10 "If you openly declare that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is by believing in your heart that you are made right with God, and it is by openly declaring your faith that you are saved."

WHY MUST GOD "RESPOND" TO SIN?

God must "respond to a sin" because sin goes against him, and he is holy. Justice requires that all wrongs be made right, so sin cannot remain unanswered. However, God's mercy and love offer us a path to forgiveness. His response is a combination of grace and hope. Despite our sins, God loves us and offers forgiveness for our wrongs.

COMING SACRIFICE OF JESUS CHRIST

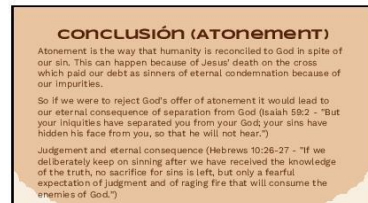
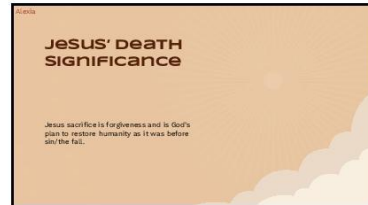
The fall of Adam and Eve: Sacrifice of Jesus—Jesus' death on the cross is to reverse the fall. Offering forgiveness and eternal life to those who believe in him.

The Flood: Jesus is the ark in which people find refuge and salvation.

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NURTURE

Students:

- Listened to testimony
- Practiced sharing the gospel with each other prior to the trip under teacher supervision and coaching.
- Spent 14 weeks in direct mentorship with a trusted adult *Questions were included in mentorship prompts to help students gain insight and direction for sharing their faith.*
- Designed & created evangelism tracts



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NURTURE

In preparation for our evangelism trip, students worked in pairs to create their own evangelism tracts. They were instructed to keep our target audience in mind when designing the tracts so that they would be functional for both the students presenting and the students to whom they would be presenting.

Tracts were designed in Spanish because we would be sharing to Spanish-speaking students. Each pair included at least one native Spanish speaker for translation purposes.



Examples of students' evangelism tracts:

QUE ES EL PECADO?

La respuesta de Dios: Jesús abrió las puertas con su muerte

Dios nos ama tanto que envió a su Hijo Jesús para morir por nuestros pecados. La muerte de Jesús en la cruz abrió el camino para que todos pudiéramos tener acceso al reino de Dios y recibir su salvación.

- "Mas Dios muestra su amor para con nosotros, en que siendo aún pecadores, Cristo murió por nosotros." – Romanos 5:8
- "Jesús le dijo: Yo soy el camino, la verdad y la vida; nadie viene al Padre sino por mí." – Juan 14:6

Este versículo es clave porque nos recuerda que Jesús no esperó a que fuéramos perfectos o mereciéramos la salvación. Su sacrificio en la cruz fue un acto de amor incondicional, para abrirnos el camino hacia Dios.

NUESTRA DECISIÓN: RECIBIR A JESÚS COMO SALVADOR

Para recibir a Jesús como nuestro Salvador, debemos creer en Él, arrepentirnos de nuestros pecados y aceptarlo en nuestro corazón como Señor.



- Romanos 10:9 – "Si confiesas con tu boca que Jesús es el Señor y crees en tu corazón que Dios lo levantó de entre los muertos, serás salvo."
- Juan 1:12 – "Mas a todos los que le recibieron, a los que creen en su nombre, les dio potestad de ser hechos hijos de Dios."

POR DONDE COMENZAR?

Creer en Dios, comienza con el deseo de conocerlo.

Leer la Biblia y orar, fortalece la fe.

Aceptar a Jesús, nos da una relación personal con Dios.

Buscar una comunidad cristiana, nos ayuda a crecer.

Student Reflections:

What did you learn from this experience?

- “To evangelize with kids is easier to do in fun ways than just speak to them.”
- “I learned that we should actually go and evangelize kids because they are the future of the world, and they should know God.”
- “I learned that I don’t have to worry so much and instead let the Holy Spirit guide me like he did yesterday.”
- “It is easy to get along with others, and I shouldn’t get nervous about doing new things.”
- “It’s important to start evangelizing kids when they are young.”



Teacher Reflections:

Students were encouraged to identify areas in which they have become more established in their faith as well as those areas in which they feel they need to grow. Then they were asked to share their faith on their level of competence with other students. Many students commented that they felt better equipped to share their faith with students because of what they have learned and practiced in class this year.
