# Throughlines:

#### Throughline #1: Earth Keepers

- Students learned about soil and composting
- Students explored why growing a garden is beneficial
- Students planted seeds
- Students took care of the plants

#### Throughline #2: Servant Workers

 Students created a plan to serve others by sharing the garden produce

# Formational Learning Experience:

**Real needs**: Students recognize that healthy foods (fruits, vegetables etc.) are necessary for healthy bodies.

Real people: Our students and people who aren't able to grow healthy plants to eat

**Real work**: Students want to use their knowledge of plants to grow a garden and provide healthy produce for people in our community.



#### INVITE

- A guest speaker came and gave us background knowledge about soil and planting seeds.
- Students collaborated with a partner to come up with 3 ways that we could use our knowledge of plants to help others in our community.

## **NURTURE**

- Students recognized that they could use food/produce to serve others.
- Students planted seeds and journaled the plants growth.

















#### **EMPOWER**

- Students collected food scraps at lunch to add to our compost bin.
- Students shared the responsibility of watering and caring for the plants.
- Students took the plants home to continue to grow, harvest, and share the produce.
















# I CAN HELP OTHERS By ...




"I can show God's love to others by sharing food."
