Joy-filled Collaborating: We enjoyed times of trying new games and collaborating to clarify rules that would be fun for everyone.






See God's Story:

- Students made games for the playground and taught other grade levels how to play fairly.








Student Reflections:

Students sharing throughlines that are meaningful to them and how they are living them out as part of God's story.








Student Reflections:
