Church of St Mary the Virgin, Rhossili SA3 1PL

One of the UK's leading quartets, admired for the precision and vitality of their playing, the Carducci play quartets by Mendelssohn – the young composer's tribute to Beethoven – and Debussy. A fascinating contrast in style.

Church of Ss Rhidian and Iltyd, Llanrhidian SA3 1ER

Champions of Shostakovich's music, the Carducci play his Third Quartet, written in the shadow of the Second World War. They are joined by cellist Thomas Carroll for Schubert's sublime Quintet in C major.

Acclaimed Welsh pianist Llŷr Williams returns with an inspired programme. Mozart's late Sonata in F is followed by Schumann's romantic fantasy Kreisleriana and Brahms's masterful Variations and Fugue on a theme by Handel.

SIMON ZHU (violin) and GORDON BACK (piano)

First prize-winner in the Paganini and Menuhin Competitions, Simon Zhu plays Bach's famous Chaconne for solo violin and a group of Caprices by Paganini. He is joined by Gordon Back in Ravel's jazz-inspired Sonata for Violin and Piano and works by Schubert and Wieniawski.
