

359 KIMBLE WINDSOR CHAIR

Kimble is a Windsor chair named after a neighbouring village of High Wycombe in Buckinghamshire, where the Windsor chair originated in the 18th century. The chair has a modernised, pared down form made using traditional Windsor chair making techniques in order to further the story, the evolution of the English Windsor chair. The contrast of the black walnut seat on this otherwise ash chair attractively highlights the wedge tenon detail where the leg intersects with the top of the seat. Part of a family of Windsor chairs including two dining chairs and two lounge chairs.



MATERIALS

TIMBER

Solid European ash with a solid American black walnut seat with a Danish oil, white oil, or black oil finish.

NOTES

Only one oil option may be chosen for the chair.

W65 × D67 × H108 cm, seat height 45 cm, arm height 72 cm
W25 3/5 × D26 3/8 × H42 1/2 ", seat height 17 5/7 ", arm height 28 1/3"
