- Mamang Koort: Heart of the Whale
Mamang Koort, the Menang Noongar name for King George Sound, is a living, spiritual heart for the Menang Noongar people. This evolving artwork invites you to step into this heart, both physically and metaphorically. Over three weekends, it will transform in colour, form and feeling. Inspired by the red, black and yellow tones of the Menang Bloodroot, a plant of deep cultural and historical significance, used for medicine, food and dyeing. The final weekend will be a riot of colour, featuring hundreds of specially grown sunflower plants and other vibrant yellow botanicals.

Created by Lara Rose Bos with local artists, craft groups, and in consultation with Menang Elders and experts, the installation features a traditional Koornt (shelter) built by Menang Custodian Larry Blight.

Getting Around

Parking and Shuttle Buses

To help manage the large crowds expected for *Lighting the Sound*, visitors are encouraged to take advantage of a free shuttle bus service operating on event nights across the three weekends. The buses will connect several park and ride locations and accommodation providers with the Albany Entertainment Centre, which is a short walk from the activation zones.

Traffic congestion is likely and town centre parking is limited. We recommend either planning to arrive on foot or via shuttle services.

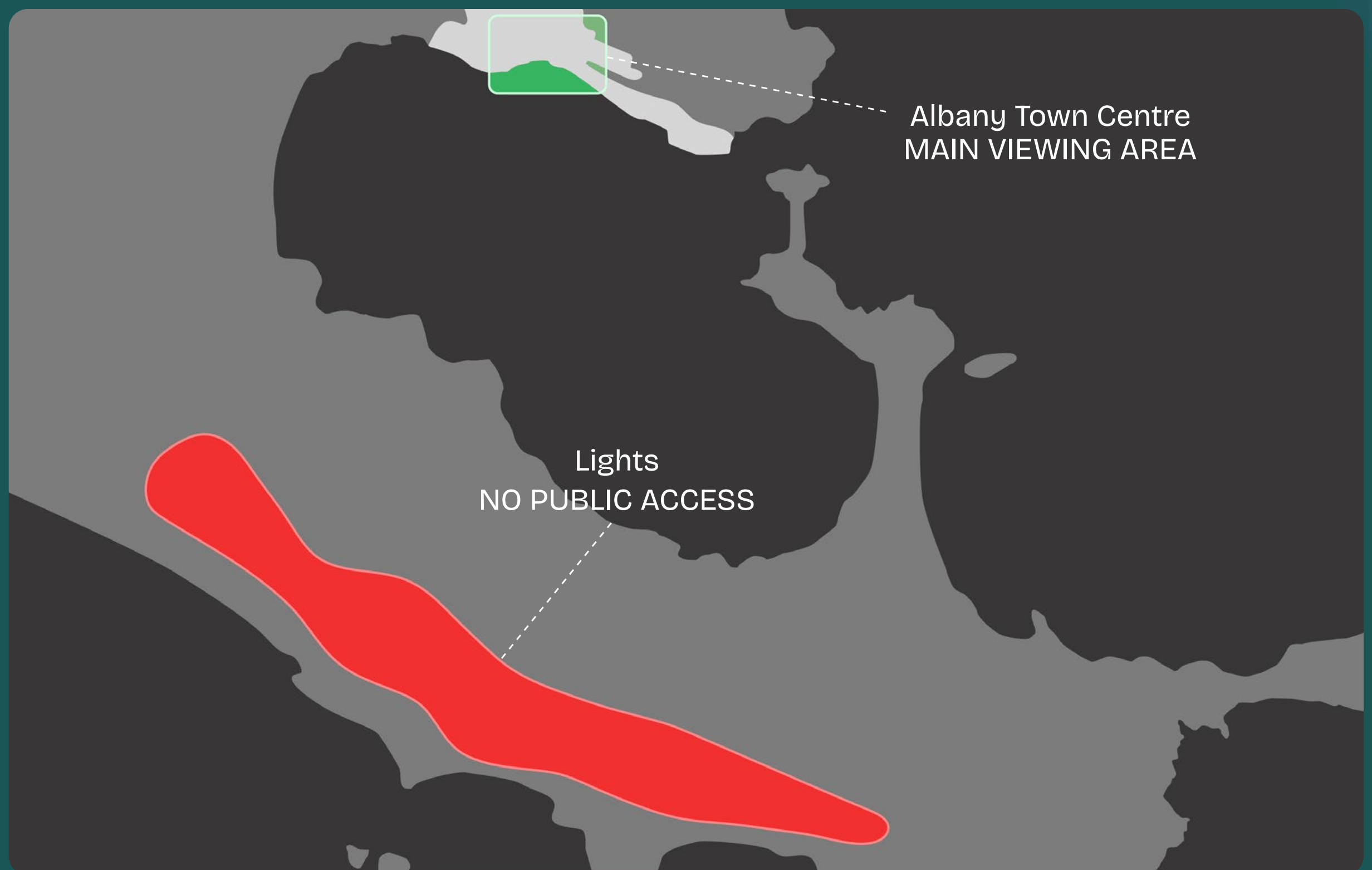

Viewing Locations

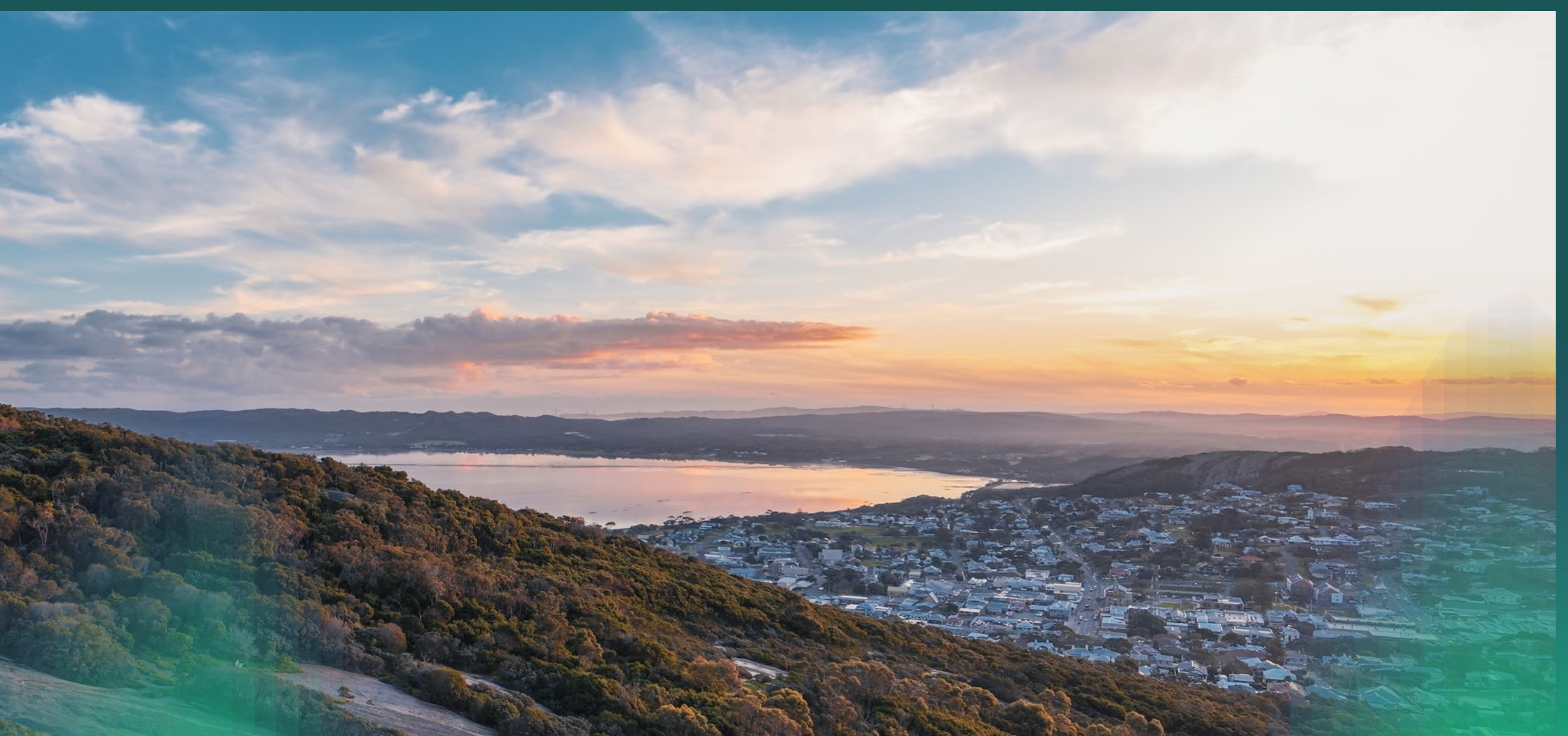
The best places for the public to see and enjoy *Lighting the Sound* are located on the 'town side' of the harbour.

No Public Access



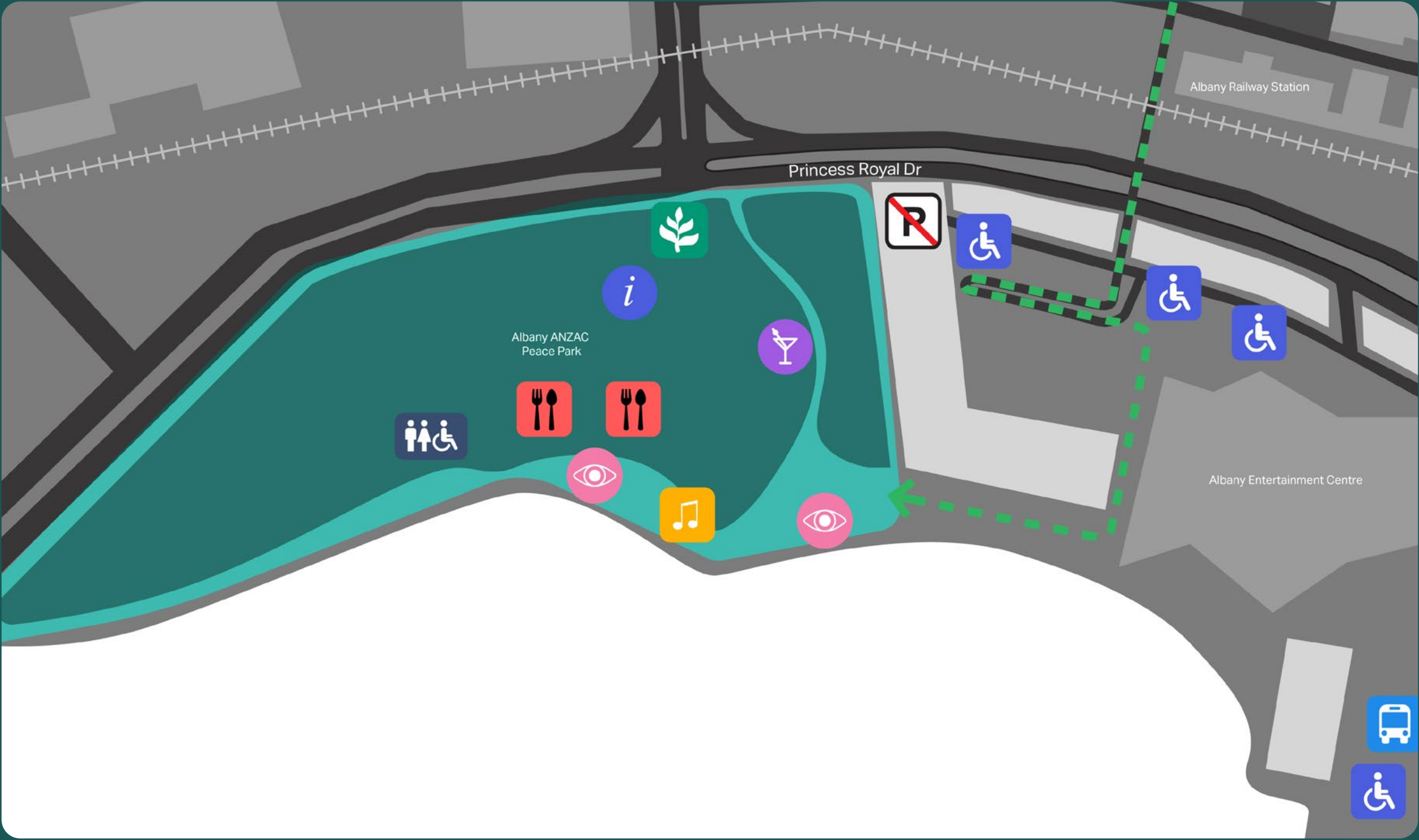

Family-oriented area with pop-up food and beverage options, kids entertainment, and front row panoramic views of the installation.

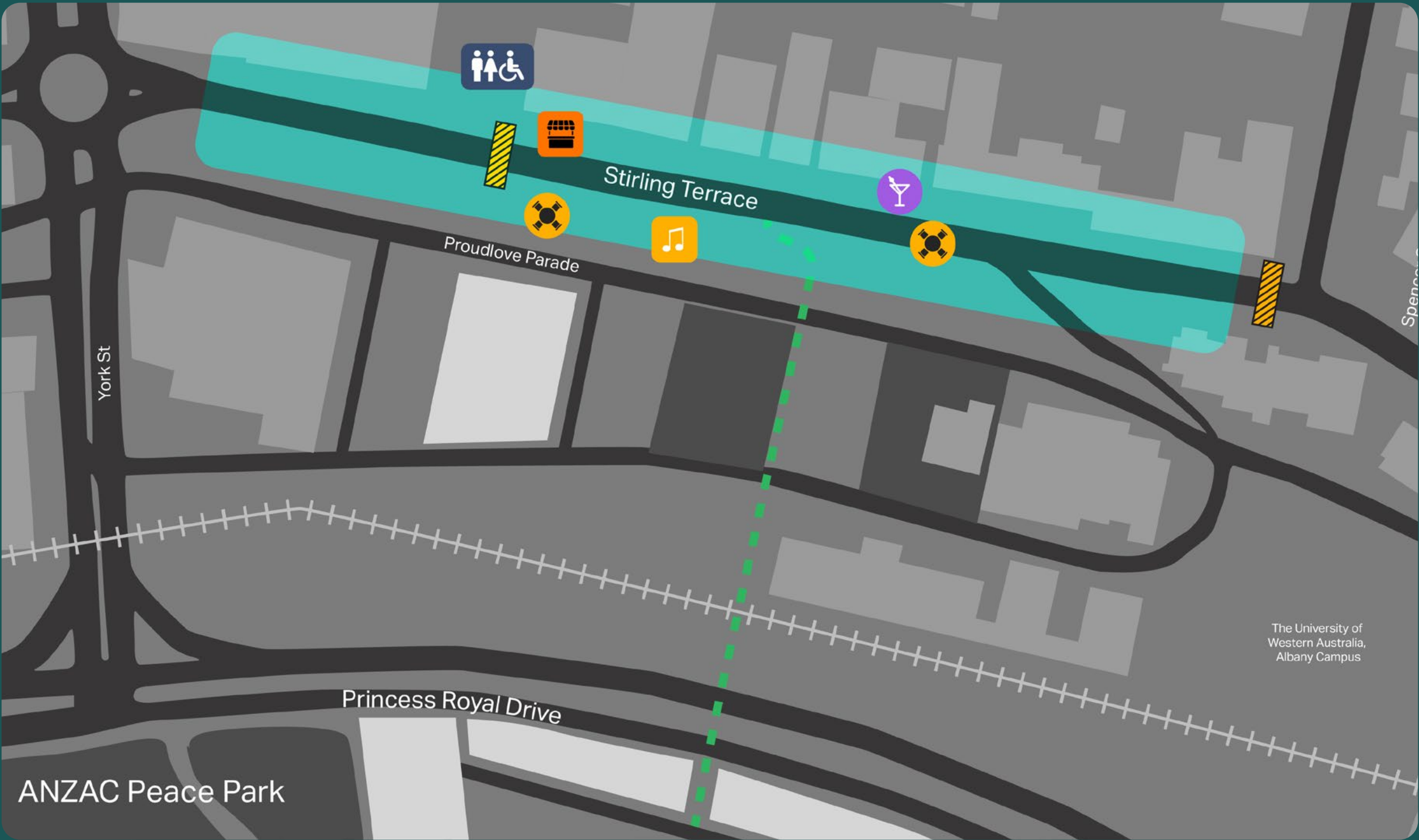

About the Artist - Kari Kola



Kari Kola is renowned for his lighting treatments of natural and human-made phenomena, notably the Connemara Mountains (Ireland), and Stonehenge (UK). Lighting the Sound is the first opportunity to see his work in Australia.

Kari visited Albany in 2024, developing “Roots of the Sky” as his concept. This is inspired by the Menang (or Bloodroot) plant, for which the region’s First Nations peoples are named, and it gestures towards elements of reconciliation and intergenerational transfer of knowledge through broad interpretations of story.

“Light is a really powerful tool and I believe that we can draw focus to any site, city, or value using light art. I plan to work on an unseen scale with unique sites and push the limits of light art into new dimensions. This will create a new level of impact in raising awareness on many topics.”

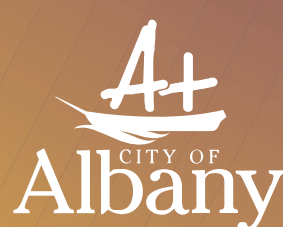
