The following information details the cumulative weight (in tonnes) of each waste stream for all Mears Group sites between 2020 and 2024.

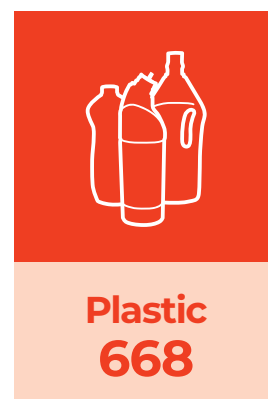
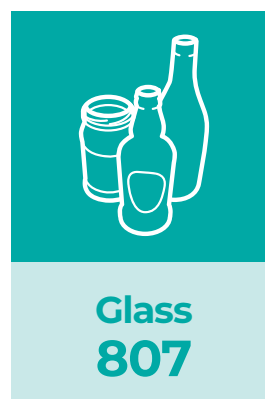
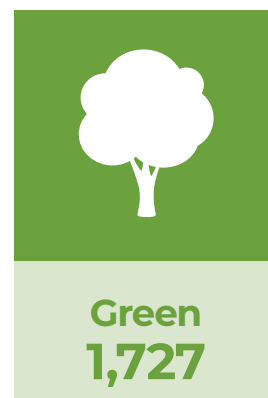


Fines and non-compliance

Mears Group has never received a fine or prosecution relating to any incidents of fly-tipping or the mismanagement of waste.

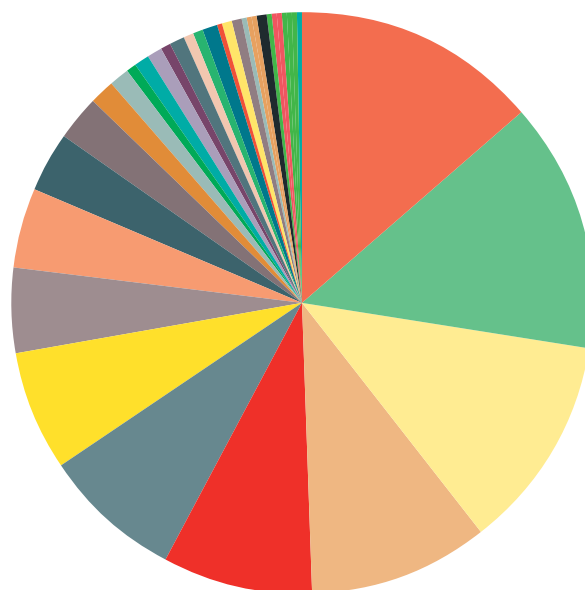
Within the last five years, Mears has also implemented a sub-contractor initiative which has further eradicated any risk of third parties disposing of Mears waste in a manner that is not compliant.
