We are now in term three and the final term of the 2024-2025 school year! This month will have a little bit of everything. In addition to continuing our academics in literature, math, and social studies, students will be in full swing with their new enhancements, and Comprehensive Student Reviews are this month as well. I look forward to all that spring will bring!

Classroom Updates

Literature: March was Reading Month, and we continue to celebrate in many ways! Students have been engaged in a Picture Book Project where they have checked out historical texts to analyze within the context of our CSA character traits and Integrated Learner Profile traits. Students also had a "Book Tasting"

to browse novels for our Independent Novel Project. Students will select a classic literature text to read and complete a series of projects. This month we will also start our next read-aloud unit:

Behind Rebel Lines: a historical fiction about a girl named Emma who disguises herself and works as a spy during the Civil War, risking her life for freedom. Additionally, we will study Civil War poetry to alian with our Turbulence and Turmoil unit in Social Studies.



Math: The instructional learning targets of the CSA middle school math curriculum focus on developing students' proficiency in key mathematical areas such as ratios, geometry, algebraic expressions, and statistics, while fostering critical thinking, problem-solving, and real-world application skills. The curriculum is designed to prepare students for high school math and beyond by encouraging a deep understanding of mathematical concepts.

Social Studies: This term, students will continue their journey through America's history by learning about the Civil War era. Students will analyze events leading up to the war, major battles and events during the war, as well as the Reconstruction time period. Students will also analyze the relationships between free and slave-holding states, as well as the policies and consequences of slavery and early attempts to abolish it. Finally, students will compare and contrast America before and after the Civil War. The unit will conclude with an oral or written assessment.



Spring 2025 Testing

Our state standardized testing for PSAT and M-STEP will occur in April and May. Students will be required to use a school-provided device for the assessment. Each exam will begin promptly at 9:00 am, requiring students to arrive no later than 8:45 am. Please note that students are not permitted to eat or drink during the exam. Breaks will be given at select times, but it will be important that students have a healthy and balanced breakfast before taking the test. Students are also not permitted to have ANY type of electronic communication with them during these tests. Students will be able to safely store them at the school, receiving access to them after the test.
