September Highlights: science/social studies

- Introduction to our unit of study: How do scientists learn about the natural world?

Character Corner:

At CSA, Smart Character Choices are an important part of our daily curriculum. Through family meetings and daily practice, we give students the tools they need to be confident, successful, and to advocate for themselves. Even in Kindergarten, we are working to empower students to make choices that are safe for themselves and for those around them. During the first week of school, we introduced a special space in our classroom called the Safe Zone. This is an area where children can go if they are feeling overwhelmed, tired, upset, or just need a quiet moment. The Safe Zone is very different from a "time-out." It is not a punishment, but rather a place for reflection, calming down, and preparing to rejoin the group when ready. The Safe Zone is equipped with tools to help children self-calm and take deep breaths. Sometimes, the teacher may check in with a child there and work together to create a plan for success in future activities. We are excited to give our students this safe and supportive tool as they learn to manage their emotions and take ownership of their choices. Ask your learner to tell you about the Safe Zone, how to use it, and where it is located in our classroom!

Field Trip to Spicers

Permission slips will be coming home this week in your child's Tuesday folder. We will be visiting Spicer's Apple Orchard. This program takes students on an exciting tour of the farm, including a wagon ride, apple and pumpkin picking, enjoying a snack of cider and doughnuts as well as gross motor exploration on the playground.

If you are interested in chaperoning, please make sure you stop by the front office to have the paperwork filled out for a background check. This needs to be filled out ASAP to be completed in time and a copy of your driver's license is needed.

The field trip will take place on *Monday*, *September* 22nd at 9:30. Students are to wear their CSA uniform while on the field trip. We will be having snack before we leave and then return to CSA for our lunch time.
