Classroom Highlights

## Writing:

We will dive into our personal narrative unit, where students learn to craft meaningful stories from their own lives. Our main focus is on writing conventions—such as punctuation, capitalization, and sentence structure—and guiding students through each step of the writing process. From brainstorming ideas to drafting, revising, editing, and publishing, students are developing their skills as confident and capable writers. We can't wait to see their final pieces shine!

## Reading:

We're learning how to choose "just-right" books—books that are not too easy, not too hard, and keep us engaged! A just-right book challenges students just enough to help them grow while still allowing them to enjoy the story. We're also focusing on what good readers do: they think deeply about the text, make connections, ask questions, and visualize what's happening as they read. We will choose our small group books at our Book Tasting on Friday, the 12th.

# Early Math:

We will be reviewing key math concepts to build a strong foundation for the year ahead. Our focus will be on place value up to 1,000—understanding the value of each digit and how numbers are built. Students will also sharpen their skills in addition and subtraction with regrouping and borrowing. We will use strategies, tools, and models to solve problems with confidence and accuracy!

# Developing Math:

Our focus this month will be review, including place value up to 1,000—understanding the value of each digit and how numbers are built—as well as rounding to the nearest ten and hundred. We will also be strengthening our addition and subtraction skills with regrouping and borrowing. Additionally, students will work on developing multiplication fact fluency to support more complex problem–solving.

#### Science:

Exploring the differences between weather and climate! Students will learn how to observe and describe daily local weather—like temperature, precipitation, and wind—while also understanding how climate describes long-term patterns in a region.

# Parent Partnership

Help support your student's learning this month by reading with them every day and asking them to share what they visualized. We highly suggest that students **read for a minimum of 15 minutes every evening.** 

Math fluency is a key part of our Voyager math unit. Building speed and accuracy with basic facts helps support deeper problem-solving and overall confidence in math.

**Practicing Reflex at home at least 3 times a week** is a great way to reinforce these skills and boost your child's success. We will send home your student's login information if we haven't already done so. Every minute of practice counts!


Character Corner
