EXPLORING FINE MOTOR

In preparation for our handwriting program, Handwriting without Tears, we have begun to work on building our fine motor skills through play dough, scissors, lego, and crayons. In the next few weeks we will begin working on writing our names but for now we are working on learning and using each other's names.







CHARACTER BOOKS

This week we have talked about accepting "No" for an answer. Accepting "no" for an answer is an important social protocol that helps children understand and work within the social, physical, and emotional boundaries of others. It can also be a tricky skill for young children who already struggle with waiting and delayed gratification. To help teach children to accept "no" for an answer we read two books that put the power of "no" in their hands and help them to see that usually a "no" from a loving and responsible adult is intended to keep them safe, healthy and happy in the long run and not just to be mean or keep them from getting what they want. We read "Don't Let the Pigeon Drive the Bus" by Mo Willems and "No David" by David Shannon to let them try on the power of "no" for themselves and experience the responsibility of keeping someone safe and the tiresome determination behind having to say "no" to someone over and over again. Your child should have brought home a "No David" puppet with which to practice

accepting "no" for an answer over the weekend.
