September Highlights:

Science and Social Studies

- Introduction to our unit of study: How do scientists learn about the natural world?
- Apple investigations: apple sink or float experiment and applesauce making!
- Sharing our hopes and dreams for the year and using these as a foundation for our class promise
- Learning about the history of John Chapman (Johnny Appleseed) and reading some of his tall tales
- Using a map to see where Johnny Appleseed lived and traveled to in the United States

Math

- Practicing counting to 100 as a group
- Completing beginning of the year math assessments
- Creating and identifying AB and ABC patterns
- Composing and decomposing, writing, and forming numerals 1-10

Reading



Sharing (Show-and-Tell)

Part of our daily Morning Meeting routine will soon give your student the opportunity to 'share' an item from home with the class. Our sharing schedule will begin Monday, September 15th and can be found on the monthly calendar sent home in your child's Tuesday folder. This type of show and tell is a meaningful way for students to practice presenting and speaking in front of a group of peers as well as responding to relevant questions and comments.

Character Corner

At CSA, Smart Character Choices are embedded into our daily curriculum. During family meetings and throughout the day, we give students the tools they need to be a confident and successful advocate for themselves! As early as kindergarten, we are working to empower students to make choices that are not only safe for themselves but also those around them. This week we will learn about our classroom Safe Zone - a place students can choose to go if they are feeling overwhelmed, tired, upset, sad, etc. Differing from a "time-out", Safe Zone is a place for reflection and getting ready to calmly rejoin the learning environment. This area is equipped with tools to help children regulate and take deep breaths if needed. It is also a place that the teacher may ask a student to visit if they need some time to reflect on their behavior. The teacher will then check in with the child and work together to make a plan for success in future activities.



<u>Field Trip to Spicer</u> <u>Orchards</u>

We will be visiting Spicer Orchards in two weeks. This adventure takes students on an exciting tour of the farm and includes a wagon ride, apple and pumpkin picking, cider and doughnut snack as well as gross motor exploration on the playground.

If you are interested in chaperoning, please make sure you stop by the front office to fill out the necessary paperwork for a background check (if you did not do this already at Open House). This needs to be done ASAP in order to receive clearance in time and will require a copy of your driver's license to be made.
