
## Ms. Frazer's Newsletter!!!

#### **National Junior Honor Society**


The NJHS Induction Ceremony will be held on Wednesday, October 29th. I wanted to send out a huge congratulations to all new members - we are inducting 18 NEW members! This ceremony is for students who were invited and accepted during the 2024 - 25 school year. NJHS serves to honor middle school students who have demonstrated excellence in the areas of scholarship, leadership, service, citizenship, and character, and challenges them to develop further through enthusiastic involvement in school activities and community service. Some examples of events that NJHS members attended in the past include Michigan Humane Society, Doggie Dash, School Beautification, Pet Drive (collecting and creating pet supplies), Warm Clothing Drive, and assisting CSA Elementary School classrooms. Members for the 2025- 26 school year have already been selected. To be considered for new membership to the CSAMS chapter of NJHS for the 2026 - 27 school year, current first and second year students must demonstrate outstanding scholarship by maintaining all A's in each content area on this school year's Term 1, 2 and 3 report cards. Invitations for next school year memberships are sent out in the summer.

#### Advisory Program:

In Term 1, students will focus on building self-awareness, responsibility, and empathy. They will reflect on their personal strengths, emotions, and mindsets—recognizing where they show growth and where they may feel stuck. Lessons will emphasize how a growth mindset connects to self-respect, how better choices lead to better lives, and how responsibility and respect work together. Students will also learn strategies for managing emotions like anxiety, practice optimism, and explore how kindness, inclusion, and empathy strengthen friendships and school community. Through discussions, examples, and real-life scenarios, students will develop the skills to make respectful choices, handle conflicts constructively, and positively impact both their own lives and the lives of others.

#### Classroom Updates:

- Literature: This month, students have been learning about narrative writing, including key features such as figurative language and descriptive imagery. Students also reviewed analysis response writing (known fondly as the Five Step Format) and practiced this technique using popular fables and fairy tales. Next, we will focus on our Science Fiction short story unit and study the lives and works of Isaac Asimov and Ray Bradbury. Readers have also been introduced to their first long-term Literature assignment in which they will choose and read a biography of an important historical figure who represents the character traits that CSAMS upholds: Respect, Responsibility, Work Ethic, Kindness, Getting Along, and Optimism. Parents, please support your student by ensuring they have a biography that is at or slightly above their reading comprehension level, and encouraging them to read each evening. Biographies should be read by December 5th.
- Science: In October, our POD A students will support a scientific argument with evidence on how the human microbiome functions and how factors such as healthy bacteria and antibiotics change the balance of bacteria in the human digestive system. Then they will step into the role of medical students to explore how the human body works at both the system and cellular level. They will begin by diagnosing a teenage patient, to learn how the digestive, respiratory, and circulatory systems work together to deliver important molecules like glucose and oxygen to cells. From there, they will investigate how cells use those molecules through cellular respiration to release energy that supports movement, growth, and repair.
- Math: The instructional learning targets of the CSA middle school
  math curriculum focus on developing students' proficiency in key
  mathematical areas such as ratios, geometry, algebraic expressions,
  and statistics, while fostering critical thinking, problem-solving, and
  real-world application skills. The curriculum is designed to prepare
  students for high school math and beyond by encouraging a deep
  understanding of mathematical concepts.
  - This month, students will be exploring concepts of numerical fluency, operations of rational numbers, as well as equations involving rational numbers and functions.
- Social Studies: This month in social studies, we explored some of the foundational principles of geography. Students learned how to plot locations on a map and use coordinates to find any place on the globe. We also examined the many ways geographers use maps to understand our world from showing population density and climate types to highlighting physical features of the land. Next, we'll head south into Latin America, where we'll explore how both the land and the ways people live change as we move closer to the equator!



#### Parent Support:

As your child embarks on a new school year this month, we encourage you to regularly engage with them at home. Establishing consistent routines—such as practicing math with flashcards, reading together, or setting aside dedicated homework time—can significantly contribute to your child's success this year.

#### **Comprehensive Student Reviews:**

Throughout the year we look forward to meeting with you to discuss your child's progress and growth in a Comprehensive Student Review. My goal is to meet with you two times during the school year (one during the fall and the second conference completed in the spring) to review your child's growth and development as a whole child: academically, socially, morally, and physically. I look forward to sharing information with you as well as hearing from you about your child.

Comprehensive Student Reviews are scheduled for October 23rd and October 24th, with other dates to follow for those who can't meet on those days. More information will be coming out soon with additional dates and a signup.
