FRIENDLY REMINDERS

- Please write your child's name in their sweaters, shoes, etc. in case they are lost. This makes it much easier to get things back when they've been lost and we've already had some things go missing.

MOTHER GOOSE OLYMPICS



FINE MOTOR

We have been working on developing our fine motor skills in class through writing, cutting, and other fine motor projects. Fine motor skills refer to any thing that develops the muscles, coordination, or dexterity of the small muscles in the hands and fingers. During handwriting I encourage the children to use their "ninja turtle fingers" which are the thumb, pointer finger, and middle finger to hold the pencil. The pencil should sit on top of the pointer finger and not under the hand. Encouraging appropriate fine motor skills such as the correct grip for using pencils and scissors helps children to use their learning tools comfortably which supports writing stamina and the completion of bigger projects.



The tripod grasp is the ultimate goal for all kindergarten aged children. In Spotted class we simply call it the Ninja Turtle grasp.



Ninja turtles only have three fingers. That's okay though because they only need three fingers to properly hold a pencil.
