Building Conflict Resolution Skills with the Peace Rose

This month we will learn about the Peace Rose. The gift of a rose is a concept from the Montessori curriculum, where a silk rose is used much like a talking stick—allowing students to take turns sharing their feelings and resolving conflicts peacefully. Maria Montessori reminds us that "children in a classroom are no different than people interacting with others in society; there will be stretches of peaceful interactions, and then differences of opinion will arise naturally over time."

Using the Peace Rose, we guide students to verbalize their feelings and use their voices in respectful, purposeful exchanges. As children learn to identify and express their emotions, they begin to see others as individuals much like themselves—each trying to find their way within the community. An inner strength emerges as they practice compassion, empathy, and open communication. They feel empowered by having the tools to express their needs, listen to others, and work together toward understanding.

At home, you might talk with your child about how they can use words to solve problems when someone does something that makes them feel sad or upset.





As part of our "training" for the Mother Goose Olympics last month, we practiced walking on a balance beam. Being able to walk on a balance beam helps children develop balance, coordination, and core strength. These are important skills for overall motor development.



The 50TH Day 1950's Celebration

Part of our daily routine includes counting the days we've been in school. This gives children practice each day counting verbally, with one to one correspondence, and of course building number sense with tens and ones which will lead into place value. One of the milestones we celebrate with this activity is the 50th day of school! This will take place on Friday, November 14th. Students may come to school in 1950's style spirit wear including leather jackets, poodle skirts, patent leather saddle shoes, etc.
