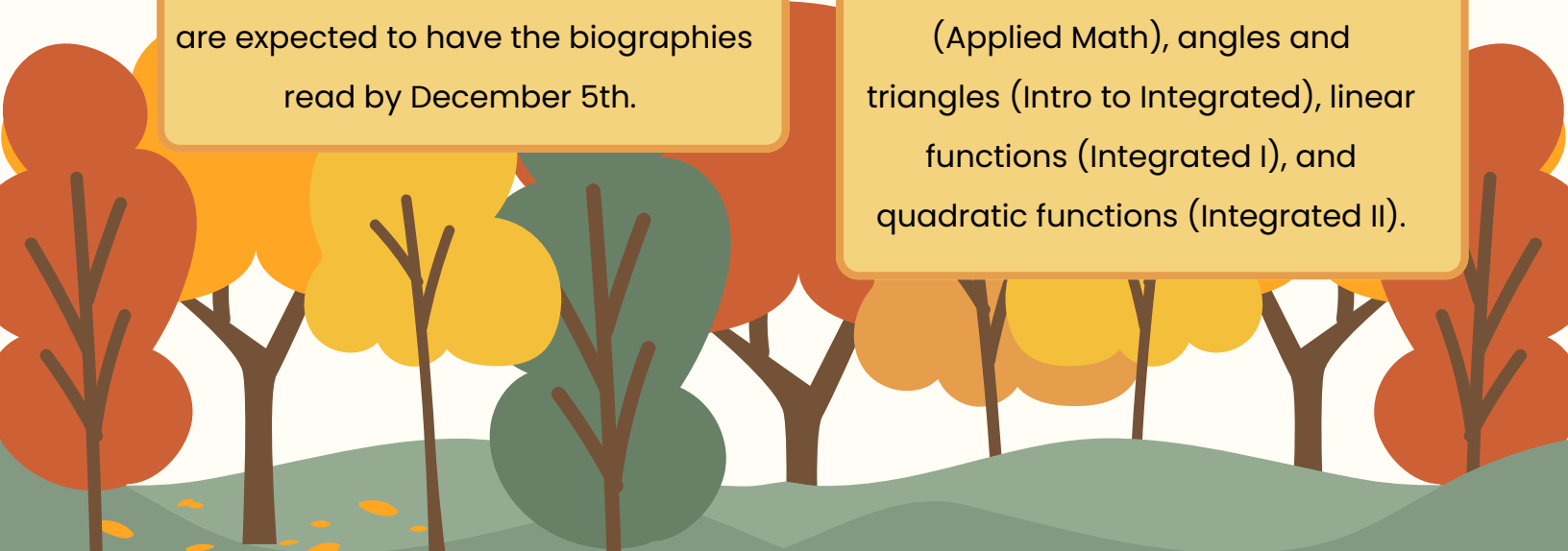
Literature

Our Term 1 novel study takes us on a journey through *The Last Cuentista* by Donna Barba Higuera. As we follow Petra's story of survival, memory, and hope, we'll explore how storytelling preserves culture and connects generations. Students will reflect on their own experiences and consider the stories that shape who they are and where they come from. Please ensure your student has selected their biography of an important historical figure who represents the character traits that CSAMS upholds: Respect, Responsibility, Work Ethic, Kindness, Getting Along, and Optimism. Students are expected to have the biographies read by December 5th.

Math

The instructional learning targets of the CSA middle school math curriculum focus on developing students' proficiency in key mathematical areas such as ratios, geometry, algebraic expressions, and statistics, while fostering critical thinking, problem-solving, and real-world application skills. The curriculum is designed to prepare students for high school math and beyond by encouraging a deep understanding of mathematical concepts.

This month, students will be exploring concepts of expressions (Applied Math), angles and triangles (Intro to Integrated), linear functions (Integrated I), and quadratic functions (Integrated II).





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Science

This month, students take on the role of geohazards engineering interns to tackle the challenge of designing ways to protect people from natural disasters. Students will use historical data on earthquakes to create an effective tsunami warning system. Throughout the project, students test and refine their designs. In the final phase, they will present a written proposal - including evidence and reasoning for their chosen sensor types - justifying why their design is the best solution.

Social Studies

This month in social studies, we explored some of the foundational principles of geography. Students learned how to plot locations on a map and use coordinates to find any place on the globe. We also examined the many ways geographers use maps to understand our world - from showing population density and climate types to highlighting physical features of the land. Next, we'll head south into Latin America, where we'll explore how both the land and the ways people live change as we move closer to the equator!





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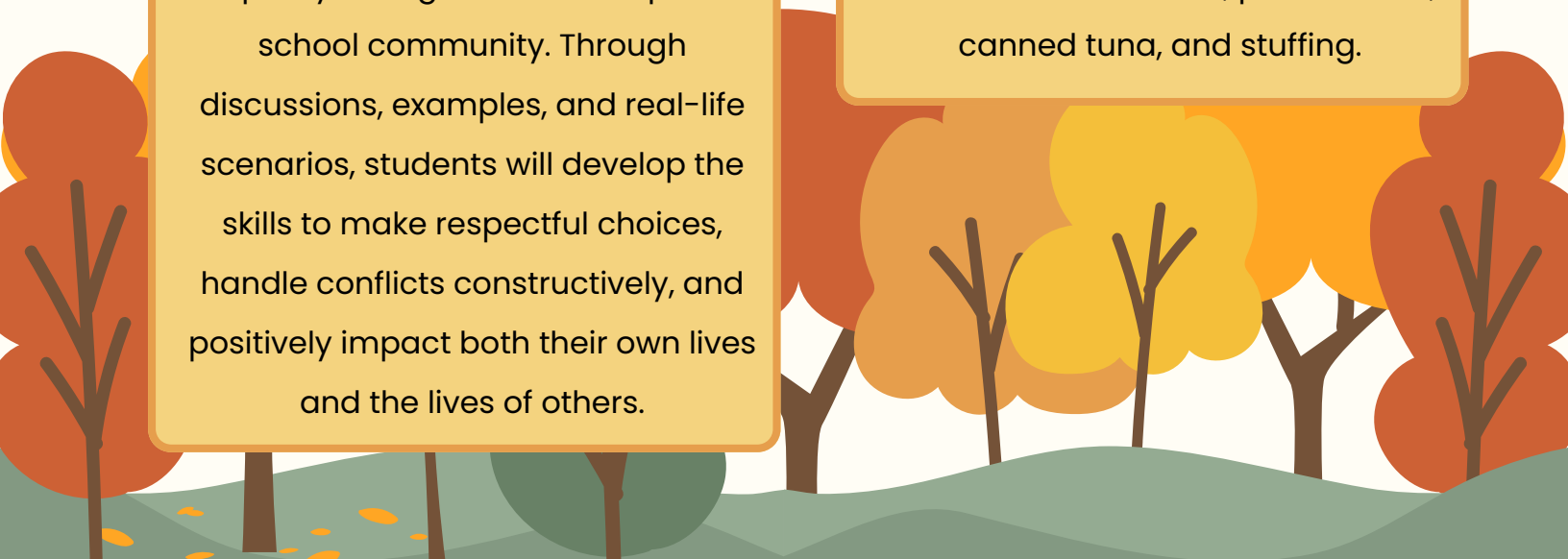


Advisory

In Term 1, students will focus on building self-awareness, responsibility, and empathy. They will reflect on their personal strengths, emotions, and mindsets—recognizing where they show growth and where they may feel stuck. Lessons will emphasize how a growth mindset connects to self-respect, how better choices lead to better lives, and how responsibility and respect work together. Students will also learn strategies for managing emotions like anxiety, practice optimism, and explore how kindness, inclusion, and empathy strengthen friendships and school community. Through discussions, examples, and real-life scenarios, students will develop the skills to make respectful choices, handle conflicts constructively, and positively impact both their own lives and the lives of others.

Adopt A Family

The CSAMS Student Government is hosting the Adopt-a-Family Food Drive during the week of November 18th to collect items to provide a Thanksgiving meal for families within the CSA community. Each advisory will collect donations for a basket of food items during the week of November 17th. The baskets will be assembled and distributed on Friday, November 21st. Suggested items for donations include boxes of mashed potatoes, jars of gravy, canned vegetables, cans of soup, boxes of muffin mix, boxed dessert mixes, macaroni and cheese, pasta sauce, canned tuna, and stuffing.





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Biography Project

This term in Literature, students will begin an exciting biography project where they'll select one influential person to study — such as a scientist, athlete, philosopher, or other revolutionary thinker from the past or present. Students will read a biography, explore articles or periodicals, and complete a series of creative projects to demonstrate what they've learned.

Project Overview:

Topic Selection: Students will choose a person of interest (teacher approval required).

Research: Students will read one biography and at least two articles about their chosen individual.

Projects & Presentation: Students will complete three projects and give a short (5-minute) presentation during our Gallery Walk on December 12.

Timeline:

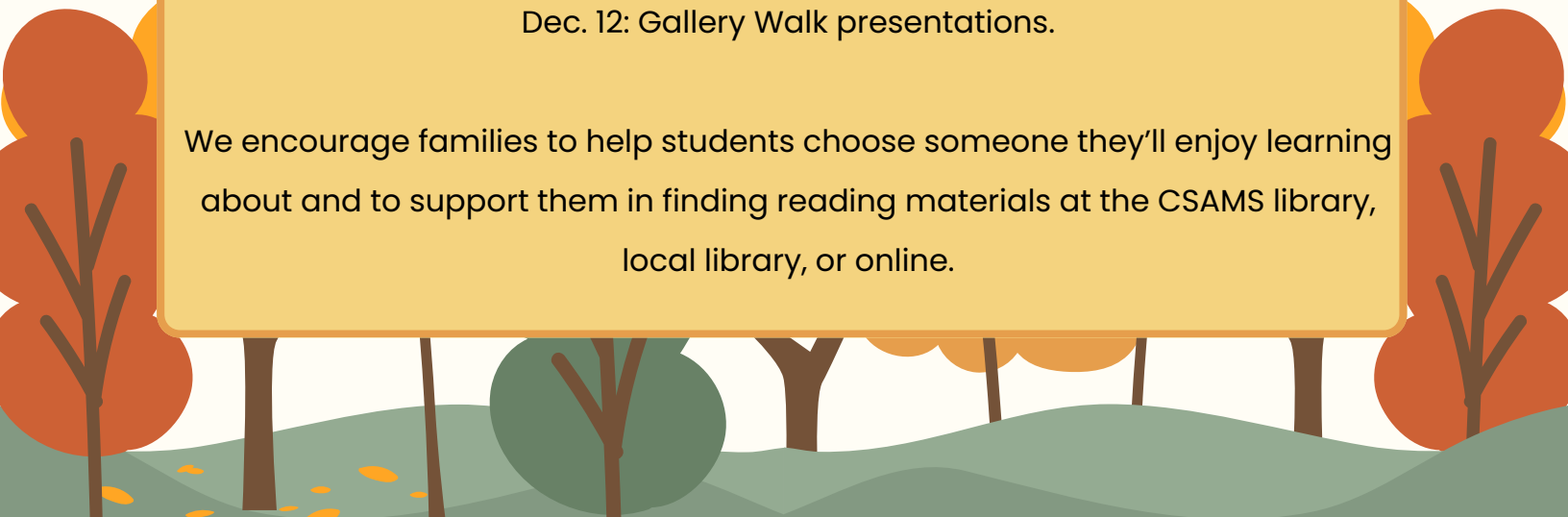
Sept. 22 – Dec. 5: Independent reading and research (biography + articles).

Dec. 8 – 11: Complete final projects in class.

Dec. 11: Final projects due.

Dec. 12: Gallery Walk presentations.
