# **INVESTIGATING PUMPKINS**

Finally, we wondered about the inside of a pumpkin and cut it open to count it's seeds! We first counted ten seeds into each cup and then counted our cups by ten. Our pumpkin had exactly 602 seeds! ### **GETTING READY FOR WINTER RECESS**

It's getting colder and colder with each passing day and before we know it we'll be bundled up to our eyeballs in winter weather gear! Problem is that winter weather gear can be downright vexing for young children. We can help them by teaching them a proper sequence and strategy for getting in and out of their snow pants, coats, boots, gloves, etc. as quickly and efficiently as possible. In school we sing the song "Snow pants, Boots, Coat, and Hat to the tune of Head, Shoulders, Knees, and Toes. We teach them to put their snow pants on very first because they can't fit their boots or coat on top of their snow pants very easily. We teach them to put their boots on next so their unprotected feet don't get stepped on by someone else's boots. Next comes their coat which they are taught to zip up immediately before they put their hat or scarf on. Finally, Gloves or mittens go on very last so they aren't trying to fasten any snaps or zippers with gloved hands. This sequence helps them to build confidence through allowing them to become more and more independent in dressing themselves for recess. It also helps our class to get out to recess quickly so that children get the most recess time possible. Please look for a winter sequencing strip in your child's Tuesday folder to practice with at home.















#### FRIENDLY REMINDERS

- •The weather is getting chillier. Please make sure your child has a warm winter coat for recess. We go outside each and every day unless it is actively raining (we will still go out if it is misty) or below zero with the wind chill. Our young fivers need the break outdoors to run and scream and yell and play with sticks and dirt and pinecones and be the young adventurers that they are. <3</p>
- •Every single thing you send to school needs to have your child's name on it unless you do not want it back. Each glove and mitten needs your child's name on it. Every sweater and jacket and even both the bottom and the lid of Tupperware. If you want it back then it needs to have your child's name on it. Our lost and found is over flowing and every Spotted student is convinced that the things in lost and found do not belong to them. Young children often do not recognize their own belongings so names really need to be on every single thing they bring to school.
- •Please be sure to wash your child's rest time things over each weekend. Sometimes things spill on them in their backpacks and they can get quite dirty very quickly

#### LOOKING AHEAD

Just some spirit wear things that your child may need in the near future

-A formal Christmas outfit for the day of the Christmas concert - No jeans, "ugly" style Christmas sweaters or over-the-top/large accessories such as reindeer antlers please. It's meant to be more of a "nice" or formal look for this day and I usually try to get good pictures of the kids in their formal Christmas outfits on this day. I also recommend a larger sweatshirt to go over the formal clothes while they eat and play.

-A more casual Christmas outfit with whatever festive accessories they like for the day of the Christmas party

-Sometimes we have a pajama day in December but that isn't official just yet.

-Looking way ahead to February we often have a dress up day for the 100<sup>th</sup> day of school in which kids can dress up like they are 100 years old or wear 100 items on a shirt or cape.
