November and it's focus on Gratefulness has always held a special place in my heart. I find when I can focus on what I'm grateful for, it transforms my mood and attitude towards everything. Now to keep that feeling all the time! Try it!

Science: This month, students take on the role of geohazards engineering interns to tackle the challenge of designing ways to protect people from natural disasters. Students will use historical data on earthquakes to create an effective tsunami warning system. Throughout the project, students test and refine their designs. In the final phase, they will present a written proposal - including evidence and reasoning for their chosen sensor types - justifying why their design is the best solution.

Math: The instructional learning targets of the CSA middle school math curriculum focus on developing students' proficiency in key mathematical areas such as ratios, geometry, algebraic expressions, and statistics, while fostering critical thinking, problem-solving, and real-world application skills. The curriculum is designed to prepare students for high school math and beyond by encouraging a deep understanding of mathematical concepts.

This month, students will be exploring concepts of expressions (Applied Math), angles and triangles (Intro to Integrated), linear functions (Integrated I), and quadratic functions (Integrated II).

Literature: Our Term 1 novel study takes us on a journey through <u>The Last Cuentista</u> by Donna Barba Higuera. As we follow Petra's story of survival, memory, and hope, we'll explore how storytelling preserves culture and connects generations. Students will reflect on their own experiences and consider the stories that shape who they are and where they come from. Please ensure your student has selected their biography of an important historical figure who represents the character traits that CSAMS upholds: Respect, Responsibility, Work Ethic, Kindness, Getting Along, and Optimism. Students are expected to have the biographies read by December 5th.

NOVEMBER 2025

Social Studies: This month, students have been finishing up our unit on prehistoric societies and early civilizations technological advancements. Students have begun the study of Ancient Egypt and will cover the Kush and Phoenicians next. They continue to gather information about early civilizations - from geographical impacts that shaped their lives, societal structures to technological advancements. All of these aspects impacted the successes and downfalls of what early civilizations faced. This also allows for discussions on how these early civilizations with their attributes and challenges helped shape the modern world that we live in today.
