January Learning Highlights

Science and Social Studies

- Explore concepts of force and motion, including push, pull, and gravity
- Plan and build a structure using the engineering design loop
- Study penguins and the continent of Antarctica as it relates to animal survival during the cold winter months
- Draw and identify the three states of matter: solid, liquid, gas
- Learn the history of New Year celebrations
- Discuss Martin Luther King Jr.'s messages of peace and equality

Math

- Adding two groups of objects to complete addition number sentences
- Taking a group of objects apart to solve subtraction problems
- Writing basic number sentences with the use of pictures
- Combining tens and ones to make teen numbers

Reading Comprehension & Phonemic Awareness

- Practicing reading "heart" and "popcorn" words by sight
- Using animal strategies to read emergent level pattern books
- Learning how readers go back a page or two to reread and rethink, solve unknown words by saying the first letter sound, think about what is happening while pointing to the words...and more!

Writer's Workshop

- Setting and illustrating school or personal New Year's resolutions
- Using checklists to make stories 'talk'
- Utilizing punctuation to tell readers when to stop




Valentine's Day Party

Accepting Differences

One of the caring habits we teach at CSA is negotiating and accepting differences. Later this month, there will be a puppet show featuring a new student who looks different and likes different things. Tabby cat begins to complain and gossip about her classmate's distinctiveness but Tom cat doesn't seem to notice. There will also be another puppet show where Tabby likes broccoli and Tom doesn't. We will learn that sometimes people don't always look the same or like the same things, but that doesn't mean they can't be friends.

Talk About It:

Have a conversation with your child about these social skills (before bedtime or during dinner are great opportunities to chat about and reinforce the important life skills we are learning in kindergarten)

Sharing and Voice Volume

This month we will also review the two social skills: **Voice Volume** and **Sharing**. Our two kitty puppets were coming in from recess and one begins shouting "YOU'RE IT!" trying to play tag in the hallway. In another scenario Tom refuses to share his markers. We will discuss how sharing can mean using the same item at the same time or taking turns. We'll reflect on times when someone didn't share with us and examine how it made us feel.

Talk About It:

Have a conversation with your child about these social skills (before bedtime or during dinner are great opportunities to chat about and reinforce the important life skills we are learning in kindergarten)



Voice Volume

Why is it important to use appropriate voice volume? What happens if we talk too loud? What if we talk too quietly? What can we do if a friend is talking too loudly?

Sharing

Why is it important to share? What should you do if someone is not sharing? When is it okay not to share? What if there isn't enough to share?
