Highlights from the Hourglass Classroom:

Here is what the Hourglass students are learning this month

This month in kindergarten, we are continuing to grow as readers, writers, and mathematicians! We will finish introducing all the letters of the alphabet by practicing letter sounds, identifying letters, blending sounds, and dictating words using those letters. Students will also learn new sight words such as *you*, *your*, *they*, *come*, *some*, and *what*. In handwriting, we will keep practicing writing CVC words using lowercase letters. During reading time, we will work on reading familiar words in a “snap” and rereading books to build power and confidence. In writing, students will learn to reread their work, use checklists to make their writing stronger, use a vowel chart to help with the middle sounds in words, and use periods to tell readers when to stop. In math, we will begin learning about subtraction and complete a benchmark assessment to check in on all the learning we have done so far this school year.

Character Corner

This month in kindergarten, our Character Corner will focus on **goal setting**! We will learn that a goal is something we work toward and try our best to achieve. Students will practice setting simple, meaningful goals, such as improving their reading, writing neatly, or being kind classmates. We will talk about how taking small steps, practicing every day, and not giving up helps us reach our goals. By learning to set and work toward goals, our kindergarteners are building confidence and pride in their learning!
