Happy January! Happy 2026!

I want to wish everyone a Happy New Year! I hope everyone had a relaxing and wonderful break. The new year brings about so many opportunities to make this the best year ever. I look forward to all of the memories and moments our advisory family will have together!

Classroom Updates

Literature: This month, students will kick off their learning with an engaging mini poetry unit focused on deep exploration and close reading. Through activities such as poem replication, text comparisons, and thoughtful analysis of themes, students will strengthen both their interpretive and creative skills. Following the Day of Service, Literature students will transition into an exciting study of Greek mythology. As they explore a variety of classic myths, students will create individual scrapbook pages that reflect their understanding and creativity. This unit will culminate in a fully assembled Greek mythology scrapbook, showcasing their learning and imaginative work throughout the study.

Math: The instructional learning targets of the CSA middle school math curriculum focus on developing students' proficiency in key mathematical areas such as ratios, geometry, algebraic expressions, and statistics, while fostering critical thinking, problem-solving, and real-world application skills. The curriculum is designed to prepare students for high school math and beyond by encouraging a deep understanding of mathematical concepts. This month, students will be exploring concepts of algebraic expressions (Foundations Math), solving equations (Applied Math), and graphing and writing and graphing linear equations (Intro to Integrated Math).

Social Studies: Students are exploring the origins of the United States government and taking a deep dive into the Constitution. We are examining why it was created, the ideas that influenced it, and how it continues to guide our government today. Students will analyze key principles such as separation of powers, checks and balances, and individual rights. Through discussions and activities, they are learning how these principles shape laws and leadership in our country. This work helps students better understand their role as citizens and the importance of an informed and active public.

Science: This month in science, students will begin by finalizing scientific arguments for how an athlete can increase cellular respiration to improve performance. Then they will take on the role of food engineer interns, applying their knowledge of metabolism to design a healthy food bar called the *FuturaBar*. Students will investigate how protein, carbohydrates, and glycemic index affect the body's energy, growth, and repair, and use this science to meet the needs of a specific target population. Using a digital design tool, students will collect and analyze data, test and revise recipes, and balance real-world constraints like taste and cost. The unit culminates in a final proposal where students justify their design choices, simulating an authentic engineering internship experience following the Metabolism unit.

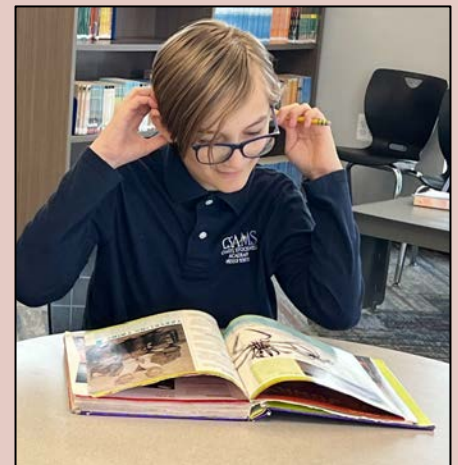
Yearbook Orders

The Importance of Reflecting

Reflecting throughout the school year allows our students to think about their classes, what they are most proud of, areas they want to focus on, and what works best for them. When term one ended at the beginning of December, our advisory students completed a reflection where they picked the assignment they did the best on, what their favorite class was, how their transition to middle school was, what they were most proud of, and what they want to do in order to be successful in term two. For each question, they had to explain their reasoning as well.



Student's Choice

We've added an activity into our weekly advisory schedule called Student's Choice. For Student's Choice, one student is selected at random and they get to pick the activity that we do for that day based on a list that we generated as a class. December's activities included Silent Ball and drawing!



Term Two: Getting Along With Others

In Term 2, we transition our focus to the Community, centered on the themes of Optimism and Getting Along with Others. Students will move from managing their own feelings to understanding the feelings of those around them. Specifically, we will target the skills necessary to use positive communication to interact effectively with peers. A major focus will be placed on the "work" of friendship: how to develop and maintain positive relationships through active listening and empathy. Finally, students will be equipped with support for conflict resolution, learning how to navigate disagreements with a helpful, optimistic mindset that prioritizes solution-seeking over blame.

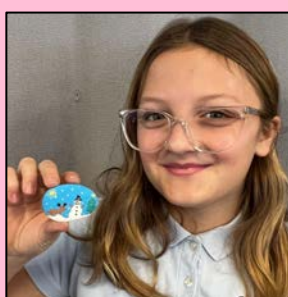
Secret Santa
